St. John's Golf Professional, Lloyd Chancey, feels that a junior provincial golf tournament is not too far away. In making this prediction, Chancey stated that most of the mainland provinces have some competition of this nature and he feels that it is indeed regrettable that Newfoundland does not possess the opportunity to give the golfers of tomorrow the chance to prove themselves today.

Junior enthusiasm is running high in Grand Falls and Corner Brook where both Clubs report a large junior registration. Golfers are eligible for junior membership until they reach the age of 19, and then if they so desire, may enroll as a student member.

Nearly all golf champions have climbed the rungs of the ladder to make a name for themselves. Peter Hope, the 21 year old winner of the Nova Scotia Open, who beat out two top Pros to take highest honors in the tournament, was a caddie at the Dartmouth Brightwood Club. Newfoundland had four Corner Brook golfers at the same contest, two of whom finished in the top fifteen.

Ben Hogan, Sam Snead, Art Wall, Jr., Gary Middlecoff and many of golf's big money earners all either worked in a caddie shop or caddied. Canada's Al Balding and Stan Leonard spent a lot of their childhood time at the courses studying the style of the older golfers. There is no need to state that this was and still is the right way to pick up the game.

Most Pros feel that there is definitely a decrease in the number of golfers going on the course to practice; they feel that many potential good golfers play too much and do not spend enough time in getting certain shots down well.

Many of today's golfers think that the only way to learn the game is to get out on the fairways and to play a game or two; this is partially true but in order to make many of their shots they must do so with a practiced hand. Therefore, why there is a lack of practice, most Pros fail to see.

Two caddies at the local Bally Haly Club, Steve Bragg and Bob Godden, took more interest in their jobs than just earning money and learned the finer points of the game. Now, caddie master Eric St. George reports the pair are becoming top-flight junior golfers.

The only things a beginning golfer needs are a couple of old battered clubs, three or four beat up golf balls and a great deal of patience and determination. The clubs and balls can be purchased with the money earned while caddying, but, along with interest comes the most important element, determination.

Golf is not a game that can be mastered in a day or two, it often takes years of hard work to accomplish anything well and then, even when a person is playing well the most important thing to his future success is to practice whenever time affords.

August 3rd, 1959

Eric St. George may fulfill a lifetime desire within the next two years by becoming a professional golfer. Eric revealed this to two **Telegram** sports-writers as he practiced a few shots at Bally Haly Monday. Between graceful swings of his club, the 19 year old, heavy-set lad told how at the age of 10, he caddied at Bally Haly and dreamed of someday earning his living at golf. "There were mornings when I was out here at six o'clock," he related. "There was never anything else in my head. When I grew up, I just had to be connected to golf somehow." This year, he got his big break. At Bally Haly in 1958, he performed terrifically. Those performances probably earned him his job of caddie master this year. From here, he expects he will continue. Lloyd Chancey, the present Pro at Bally Haly, who is serving his 51st year, is teaching him the ropes.

St. George explained that there are two types of professional golfers ... the teaching pro and the tournament pro. He plans on being the former, although tournament play is not out of this head. "I'd like to get on the mainland and see just what I could do," he says. It would gain him the experience of playing tough competition. The teaching pro is one who becomes Pro at a golf club. He is there to teach club members. And that's the type of job Eric would like. But he's not rushing into it headlong. "I've still got much to learn," he said, as the little white speck disappeared over the trees. His best scores were recorded last year: he shot a 32 for the front nine, which was three under par and tied a club record. He shot a 30 for the back nine, which is one above the record and four under par. He also scored his first hole-in-one ... on number three. Eric bought his own clubs for the first time last year ... and he admits, with a grin, that they were pretty cheap ones.

You may consider the Ayre trophy on loan for this year only, unless, of course, you double-cross us again." He extended an invitation to the Grand Falls Club to send a team into St. John's this current season. The invitation was accepted by Pinsent who said "we will do what we can to make it to the City."

Chris Hope, speaking on behalf of the Grand Falls Club expressed the pleasure of the Club in having the Bally Haly team as their guests again. Max Pratt offered the Grand Falls Club "sincere congratulations to the team and to Fred Rockwood with his new record." He complimented the Club and ladies' section for their warm

hospitality and preparation of the buffet luncheons. He said, "this is the best tournament and visit we have ever had to Grand Falls." Both teams were guests of the A.N.D. Co., at the Grand Falls House Sunday night, winding up the tournament for 1959.

One Over Par For The Course

During Sunday's single matches in the Grand Falls-Bally Haly inter-town golf tournament, one individual player stood out alone in an almost professional bracket. Fred Rockwood, Jr., teed off at 10:00 a.m. Sunday, expecting a normal game somewhere in his usual up's. He was competing against Inspector R. W. Duff of St. John's, in the inter-town singles matches. At 10:00 a.m. he was the Grand Falls Golf Club's record holder for 18 holes with a 71 score, three over par for the course. Par for the Grand Falls Riverside Course is 68. When he set the Club's new all time record of 71 three years ago, he beat his well-known and prolific golfing father, Fred Rockwood, Sr.'s, former all-time course record for 71. The senior Rockwood held the course record for several years.

Sunday, as the junior Rockwood reached the eighteenth hole with his opponent Inspector Duff, he made his final putt - tallied his score card and discovered he had set a new all-time record for the club, one over par for the course. So, with his final putt, Fred Rockwood, Jr., set a new record for the 68 course, surpassing his former 71 score. One well known member of the club said, "That is one record even the golfing Rockwoods will find hard to surpass."

Pro Peter Shymco Sets New Record At Blomidon Golf Club, Corner Brook

Pro Peter Shymco breezed around the tough, tricky Blomidon Golf and Country Club course Sunday to set a new course record - a three under par 69. September 27th, 1959. The old record was held by Col. John Burkett of Ernest Harmon Air Force Base who scored a 71 in tournament play in 1957. Shymco, a 5'11", 220 lb. Manitoban came to Corner Brook three years ago from Lunenburg, Nova Scotia. He carded a 34 on the first trip around the nine hole course, then went around the second time in 35.

His mates were H. Wick, Dave Stevenson and Bill Howell. Shymco putted only 29 times. He three-putted the 2nd and 7th greens on the out nine, bogeyed twice and had five threes. Inward, he bogeyed twice and fired four threes. His 34 score outward Sunday equalled his own nine hole record for the course. It was his first 34 this season, though he had five in 1958 and three in 1957. Shymco got his golf start in Winnipeg where he captured the Manitoba Junior Open in 1935 - 36. He was assistant pro at the Ashburn course in Halifax, became Pro at Bridgewater, N. S., in 1946, spent four years at Truro and three at Lunenburg. He holds course records in Digby, N.S. and Lunenburg. He was runner-up in the Nova Scotia Open four times.

Shymco's brightest pupil, to date, is a Lunenburg girl, 21 year old Rita Lohnes, a golfer with a four handicap, this year she won the Nova Scotia Open, the Maritime tourney at P. E. I. and the Moncton City Open. Last year, it was the Nova Scotia Open, Lunenburg Club championship and was runner-up in the Canadian Junior. In 1957, she won the Nova Scotia Open and junior titles and was runner-up in the Maritime club championships. The finish for the 1959 season in Corner Brook isn't far off and soon Shymco will be thinking in terms of

curling. He has coached the Corner Brook schoolboy curling team in two national tournaments - at Charlottetown, P. E. I. in 1958, and Calgary, Alberta in 1959.

The golf season officially came to a close Thursday, November 26th, 1959 as the Bally Haly Golf and Country Club held its annual presentation of trophies and awards at the ultra-modern clubhouse. Max Pratt, President of the Club, was emcee for the presentation and in brief welcoming remarks, paid tribute to the untiring efforts of the various committees who supervised the golf this season. Mrs. Pratt presented the huge number of trophies and prizes to the men and lady golfers.

Rated As Best In Province: St. George Enters Tourney, June 20th, 1960

Young City Athlete In Nova Scotia Open Golf Championship - Eric St. George played on the Junior St. John's All-Star hockey team last winter. He made the trip to Grand Falls for the Provincial finals and performed well on the ice. Off the ice his whole conversation centered around the sport that he loves most ... GOLF ... and next Monday he will enter his first professional golf tournament. The quiet athlete plays fine hockey and has been up around the top scorers in the local junior league the past two seasons but he is rated as the top golfer in Newfoundland.

Eric leaves St. John's on Wednesday to carry the Bally Haly Golf and Country Club colors into the Nova Scotia Open Golf Championship at Ashburn Golf Course at Halifax. He'll be competing against the top professional and amateur golfers in the Maritimes. Eric will take a TCA plane from Torbay on Wednesday at 2:30 p.m. This will give him four days to practice and get accustomed to the Ashburn Course. With \$500.00 in prize money the Tournament is expected to draw the top professional and amateur golfers in the Maritimes. First place money is \$250.00 with \$150.00 going for second spot, \$75.00 for third and \$25.00 for fourth. The entries will play 72 holes with 18 set for Monday and Tuesday and 36 for Wednesday. Amateur Peter Hope was the winner last year and he is expected to be back this season.

St. George is serving his second year as assistant pro at the Bally Haly Club under Lloyd Chancey who Eric credits with "teaching me most of what I have picked up." Chancey rates St. George as "about the best in Newfoundland, day by day." The Bally Haly Pro went on to say "Eric is only young and still has a lot to learn. He'll be up against some very experienced golfers and the course will be new to him. If the tournament was here in St. John's many of those golfers wouldn't have a chance against Eric. Under the circumstances everyone will be real happy if Eric can make a half decent showing."

Eric expressed his thanks to the Bally Haly Board of Governors last night for making the trip possible and Ian Reid, Club President, told the News last night that the Board was happy to be able to send Eric to the tournament. "We are sending him away," the President said, "so that he will be able to meet other Pros in the

Maritimes. It will enable him to see other golf courses and gain experience from playing in top competition. He will be able to learn much under these conditions. We wish him all the best of luck."

St. George started his golf career at the age of ten as a caddie at Bally Haly. He was a caddie for seven years and a member of the Club for one season before becoming assistant pro two years ago. The year he was a member Eric copped the Men's Medal Play Championship against other members of the Club in 36 holes. His best score for the 18 holes at Bally Haly is a two under par 67. Lloyd Chancey also had a 67 for the course but this was when the par was 70 and Eric rates Chancey's score as better than his. The 67 scores are the top for the course. St. George swings right in golf but when he plays hockey or baseball he shoots and bats left.

Speaking of the coming tourney. Eric told the **Daily News** last night that he was nervous. "We have no sand bunkers at Bally Haly and I may have trouble if I get into any. Golf is my first love with hockey second. Golf is different than hockey. In hockey you play opponents and have team mates to help make up for a mistake. In golf you play the course and it's all yourself. I play at least 18 holes of golf per day at Bally Haly and often get in 36 holes, but I'm excited about the coming tournament." "Local golfers," Eric went on, "hit their peak in late July or August because of the long winter layoff. This is my first big golf tournament and I hope I've had time to get in shape. I expect tough competition as most of the Maritimes golf pros are originally from Western Canada."

Young Pro Gets Tourney Try In Nova Scotia, June 21st, 1960

Eric St. George got the feel of his first golf club as a 10 year old wheeling a caddie cart over the green of the Bally Haly golf course. Since that first grip ... that first big stroke, only one ambition has burned in his mind ... to become a pro golfer and someday be good enough to show his wares in mainland competition. Things have certainly happened fast for the now 20 year old golfer. From a caddie he became the Country Club's caddie master in 1958 and in August of last year turned Pro. He is now assistant teaching pro to Lloyd Chancey at Bally Haly. Chancey is a 52 year veteran of the game and is presently teaching St. George the ropes. Now another of his dreams has become real.

Wednesday afternoon the local Club will send him to Halifax to compete in the Nova Scotia Golf Association's annual \$500.00 Open Pro-Amateur golf tournament. Eric will have four days to practice on the Ashburn Golf course before teeing off in the three day 72 hole stroke play, which begins on Monday, June 27th. Eighteen holes will be played on the opening day, 36 more on Tuesday and 18 on Wednesday to clue up the tourney.

Since May 5th, Eric has spent upwards to six hours a day on the course teaching and practicing his golf. He shot a 70, one over par earlier this year. Some of Eric's best scores were shot in 1958. He had a 32 for the front nine, three under par which tied a Club record. He also shot a 30 for the back nine which was one above the record and four under par. He also scored his first hole-in-one that year ... on number three.

Leaves For Golf Tourney, June 22nd, 1960

Eric St. George, assistant pro at the Bally Haly Golf and Country Club, leaves Torbay Airport by TCA at 2:30 p.m. today for Halifax. He will spend the next four days getting accustomed to the Ashburn Golf Course. On Monday the young St. John's athlete will tee off with the top amateur and pro golfers in the Maritimes as the Nova Scotia Golf Association's annual \$500.00 Open Pro-Amateur golf championship gets underway. It will be the first big tournament for the 20 year old City golfer who is rated as the top in the Province. Last year Peter Hope, an amateur, copped the Nova Scotia Open with a score of 307 for the 72 holes. Lloyd Chancey, Pro at Bally Haly, gives St. George a good chance in the event.

Nervous, Not Scared St. George Will Tee Off, June 25th, 1960

HALIFAX, N.S. - I start at ten this morning in my first big golf tournament and I'm nervous but I'm not scared. I'm one of 17 Pros competing in the Nova Scotia Golf Championship. There are 44 amateurs also entered. Pro Buddy Reardon, an amateur and myself will form my threesome for the first round today. I've got 18 holes today and another 18 holes tomorrow. On Wednesday we shoot 36 holes. The past four days I've covered the Ashburn course, where the tournament will be held, three times and for the 54 holes I've shot, my total score was 219. I had a 72, 73 and 74.

Par for the course is 67 but none of the 61 entries have hit the par in the past few days. Peter Doig, one of the

favorites in the tourney, had 68 for the top score last week. Defending champions, Peter Hope of Bridgewood, N.S. and Doig are expected to be the big men in the event. The fairways on the course are tight and I'll have to be careful. The greens are just great. The weather has been wonderful and I'm looking forward to doing better in the next three days than I did in practice last week. Everyone has been wonderful with the other entries being friendly and the various officials going out of their way to be helpful. Leaving the Ashburn Club last night I ran into Don Parsons of St. John's. He's up here with Bowring Brothers.

I met the top golfers in the Maritimes this past week and I've had a chance to discuss about every aspect of the game with them. I've picked up quite a few pointers that I hope will improve my game. The next three days are important ones for me. They will be the big ones as far as this tournament is concerned and I'm hopeful of doing well.

St. George Opens Tourney Today

HALIFAX - Eric St. George, a sharp-driving St. John's, Newfoundland shotmaker, will trade strokes with a field of 61 top Maritime golfers today as the Nova Scotia Open Golf Championship opens at the sprawling Halifax Ashburn Golf Course. St. George, Assistant Pro at Bally Haly Golf Club, is the lone Newfoundlander in the 72 hole, three day tournament which will be decided by medal play. The Halifax weather office forecasts sunny weather for today's opening 18 holes over the par 67 course. Temperatures were expected to be in the high 70's and low 80's as the players moved in threesomes. Westerly winds, expected to gust to 25 miles an hour around noon, were expected to give the golfers a few anxious moments. St. George was scheduled to tee off at 10:42 A.D.T. playing with Robert Reardon of Halifax and Jim Dumeau.

Up for grabs is the MacCulloch Trophy, the Nova Scotia Golf Association's top award. Defending champion is Pete Hope, long ball hitting Dartmouth, N.S. golfer, who won the crown last year at Lingan Country Club Sydney. Hope and Allan Ogilvie of Moncton, a Pro at the Ashburn Club, are the pre-tournament favorites. Both know the sometimes difficult course. Ken Zabowski, former Ashburn Pro, holds the course record of 60, while veteran Rex Joudrey of Halifax tossed the course in 62 for the top amateur mark. Two rounds are scheduled Tuesday with the final 18 holes being played Wednesday.

Record Entry List Out, Title Course Is Sharp

HALIFAX - All four Atlantic Provinces are represented on Ashburn's Number One tee where a record field of 61 Pros and Amateurs started gunning for the Nova Scotia Open Golf Championship Monday. Among the Pros seeking a share of the \$500.00 in prize monies and the MacCulloch Trophy is St. John's Eric St. George. The youthful, long ball hitting Pro was in camp Sunday and gained more than a few admirers in his practice rounds.

The 61 man field shows 14 Professionals in the fold. Among the amateurs are Ashburn's Pete Doig - first amateur ever to capture the Open - and Pete Hope, who lugged home the title last year. Doig cracked the Pro's stranglehold on the laurels when he outshot the field at Ashburn in 1955. His one over par 68 practice round Sunday makes him a definite threat again this year. Hope became the third amateur to wrest the title when he fired steady golf for a 307 over the Lingan Course last summer.

St. George whose all round game seemed to take a liking to Ashburn's tight fairways, cruised around in a highly respectable 72 Sunday. That card placed him among the top half dozen in tuneup play and there are those in the crystal ball brigade who figure the young clubber will be a strong threat for a money slot. Ashburn, in suburban Halifax, is in tremendous shape for this one. An ideal spring of early sun and sufficient rain, has made it lush, fast and competitive. It sprawls 5,515 yards, is well trapped and has tight, testing fairways. Greens are in excellent shape and many veteran tournament players said Sunday they have never seen the course play better. Almost anyone you can name in the field is capable of lifting the title. Among the early favorites in the Pro brigade are host Al Ogilvie, Jimmy Walker, (Moncton), St. George, Cecil Dowling, (Charlottetown), Jock Monroe, (North Sydney) and George Gilmurray, (Lingan). Monroe was low Pro last year after a playoff with Dowling. Top notch amateurs are a dime a dozen for this one. At random you could name Hope, Doig, Rex Joudrey, (Ashburn), Charlie Brace, (Ashburn), Floyd Keddy, (Brightwood), Perry Locke, (Brightwood) and many others. Any one of them would get even money from a betting man.

For statistical minded fans, only one man has lifted the Open Crown more than once. He is Ashburn's fabulous former Pro Zabowski who turned the trick four times. He holds the record of 272 for 72 holes in the event. As a sidelight, he also holds the course record at Ashburn, a sensational 60. Course record for an amateur is held by Joudrey who blistered a 62 several years ago. Lowest winning amateur score in the Open was Eddie Crowell's 279. A last thought from crystal ballers: they have looked over the field, the course and the weather and are predicting the victor will have to shoot a neat 277 to win. The schedule calls for 18 holes yesterday, 36 today and the windup 18 Wednesday afternoon.

St. George Is Seventh Putts Make Difference, June 27th, 1960

HALIFAX - Putts were the big factor for me in the first 18 holes of the Nova Scotia Open Golf Tournament. I missed a one foot putt on the fourth hole and this threw me off for the next three. I shot a 73 for the 18 holes with a 38 for the front nine holes and 35 for the back nine.

Defending champion, amateur Peter Hope, took the first round lead with a par 67 while I'm tied for seventh in the tourney standings but have a fourth spot tie as far as the Pros are concerned.

The amateurs are competing for a special trophy while us Pros are playing for a share of the \$500.00 prize money. Lorne Smith is second with a 68 while Rex Joudrey is third with 69. Both are amateurs and Joudrey holds the course record with a 62. George Gilmurray leads the Professionals. He's got a 70 with Cecil Dowling and Harold Morash next in line with 71's. Alan Ogilvie, Pro at the Ashburn Club has a 72 for third in the Pros. I'm tied with three others with 73's. We'll play 36 holes, two rounds today and finish up with 18 holes tomorrow. My threesome for today will be Peter Doig and amateur L. Nightingale. Both had a 73 yesterday. The temperature was in the 80's yesterday and if the warm weather continues today it should take a lot out of us.

My troubles started when I missed the one foot putt on the fourth hole yesterday. I was one over par on that hole and went one over on the fifth, sixth and seventh. Stroking a par on the eighth hole settled me down but the putts still gave me trouble. I had a birdie on the thirteenth. Par for the front nine holes is 33 so I was five over but in the back nine the par is 34 and I had a 35. I'm looking forward to at least two 70's today. I got good distance on the fairways but my putting on the greens was below par.

Only One Under Par: St. George Still In, June 27th, 1960

HALIFAX - Amateurs controlled play over the opening 18 holes of the Nova Scotia golf championships but swinging into today's 36 holes of the 72 hole event, it shapes up as a fight to the final green.

Defending champion Pete Hope, the youthful Dartmouth Brightwood belter, was the only swinger in the 61-man field to solve par. He did just what the score card says to do - went out in 33 and did the back nine in 34. He piled up 16 pars, a birdie and a bogey. On his heels was clubmate Lorne Smith with a 68 and a stroke behind him was perennial Ashburn amateur threat Rex Joudrey. George Gilmurray, an angular professional from Cape Breton's Lingan layout, is the first play-for-pay lad to make an appearance. His 70 placed him fourth entering today's morning and afternoon draws.

Tied for fifth were Pro Cecil Dowling of Charlottetown and Ashburn amateur Haddie Morash at 71's. Pro Alan Ogilvie, Ashburn, and Jock Monroe, North Sydney, shared the 72 slot with Ashburn's Bryson Crowell. Newfoundland entry Eric St. George is among those definitely in the running. He carded a 73 to stand in a tie with Pro Jimmy Walker of Moncton and amateurs Pete Doig and Laurie Nightingale, Ashburn.

Like many other entries in the test, St. George found the course a bit too sharp. The weather was balmy, with the temperature sitting in the 70's. However, the greens were lightning fast and the high holes were played in tricky, fickle and sometimes disastrous breezes. Best indication of this was Doig. Rated as the man who "owns" Ashburn, he needed 37 putts over the 18 holes. Doig, who is long off the tee, steady in the fairways and deadly on the greens, fully attested to the fact that it took a lot of adjusting to get the putting game down in this meet.

This made St. George's tally impressive. He outstroked the other members of his threesome - Pro Bud Reardon and Jim Dumeau. Most of his problems came on the front nine where he carded a five over par 38 with bogeys in one, four, five, six and seven. After the turn he bogeyed eleven but picked up his lone bird of the round on the 320 yard thirteenth. A bogey on a 265 yard straightway final cost him a chance to tie in the sixth slot.

Two of his bogeys were on what are rated the toughest holes on the course - seven and eleven. The numbers are lucky for dice throwers but deadly for golfers on this course. Seven is 415 yards, uphill. Lies fall off to right over 220 yards. Long hitters, especially, have trouble on it. Number eleven is a deceptive 215 yard, par three. The green is tucked behind a hill just over 200 yards away on a tight line to the pin. Top players favor two or three irons because slope on the green will half a long shot. Most players pitch in from edge of green for well-deserved threes.

Todays draw sends St. George out at 9:24 a.m. and 2:24 p.m. in company with Nightingale and Doig. Following is the breakdown on St. George's round:

Amateur Bids For 2nd Win At N.S. Open, June 28th, 1960

Bally Haly Pro Slips

HALIFAX - Amateur Peter Hope, being pressured by Lingan Professional John "Jock" Monroe, is hanging on to a precarious two-stroke lead today as the Nova Scotia Open Golf Championship swings into the final 18 holes. Yesterday saw a rugged 36 hole schedule in the 72 hole event and the result was as predicted - the field split wide open under the grueling schedule and tournament pressure. Hope, defending champion in the Open, fired a one-over-par 68 and a 70 yesterday to run his tally to 205. If he doesn't falter today, he'll become the first amateur in the history of the event to capture it twice.

Monroe hit a sizzling pace yesterday. He chucked a shaky 72 in the first 18 holes but bounced back yesterday with par 67 and one above par 68 to show a 207. Still within shooting distance is Ashburn's Pete Doig. He too, rebounded yesterday after a sad opening round. He matched par in the morning draw yesterday and carded 69 on the afterpiece for a 209. Unless one or all of those lads collapse today, the rest of the field will be doing their tours strictly for exercise.

One of the big sufferers yesterday was Newfoundlander Eric St. George. The personable young Pro, who clicked for a highly respectable 73 Monday, soared to 81 and 79 for a 233. St. George, who admitted tournament pressure took its toll along with "the fastest greens and narrowest fairways I've ever played" was in trouble most of the day. In his morning round he managed to hit only eight holes in the par figures. He bogeyed six holes, double bogeyed three and went three over par on the tough number 11. In the afternoon he collected 10 pars but also carded five bogeys. He took a whopping seven on the par three eighth and double bogeyed 16 and 18. On 18, his approach bounced off a tree into a sand trap which gave him a lot of trouble.

"This is really a tremendous experience," said St. George. "Playing on a course like this and watching some of these top flight tournament veterans is a million dollars worth of experience. He said he found the fairways tighter than those on his home course and also found the sand traps deceptive. You play those traps as though the sand is as solid as it looks ... and you find you're just blasting sand without moving the ball."

He was disappointed after his problem-filled rounds yesterday. "In three practice rounds before the tournament, I shot a 71, 72 and 73. When I started with a 73 Monday, I was sure I could work closer to the par in the later rounds." Today's round calls for St. George to tee off at 1:03 p.m. with W. Newell and D. Francis.

Tensed Up; St. George Has 81 And 79 And Drops Back, June 28th, 1960

HALIFAX - I tensed up ... I was too careful ... and I came up with an 81 and a 79 to drop well back in the Nova Scotia Open Golf Championship yesterday. My total for the 54 holes to date is 233 with 18 holes remaining. I'm around twentieth in the Tournament and seventh in the Pros. I have picked up quite a few tips here at the Ashburn Course and while I'm disappointed, I'm not discouraged. I'm hoping to do much better in the last round today.

Peter Hope, Dartmouth amateur, who won the tourney last year is holding a two-stroke lead over Jock Monroe of North Sydney. Hope, who had a 13 over par 305 to win last year has 205 for the first three rounds while Monroe has 207. Hope went one over par 68 in the first round yesterday and had 70 in the afternoon. Monroe had a par 67 yesterday morning and a 68 in the afternoon. Monroe tops the Pros while George Gilmurray of Sydney has a 54 hole total of 212. Peter Doig, one of my partners yesterday, appears to be the only amateur with a chance to catch Hope. Doig had 73, same as myself in the opening round on Monday but posted a par 67 and a 69 yesterday and is four strokes off the pace with a total of 209.

I'm 28 strokes behind Peter Hope and with only 18 holes remaining can only hope to move up in the standings with a close to par score today. We tee off at 1:00 p.m. and I've got R. Newell and D. Francis as my partners. The eighth hole yesterday morning was my worst of the tourney, to date. I got into a sand bunker and while I've been in them three or four times before I had plenty of trouble getting out yesterday. I went four over par with a seven on a par three hole.

Feeling that I had to do much better than in the opening round on Monday was my big mistake yesterday. Trying to be careful on my approach shot I tensed up and held back. This coupled with the same old trouble with my putts gave me two high scores. I was hoping for low 70's at least. My drives were bad yesterday and despite several good drives down the fairways the greens again gave me trouble.

I'm mostly disappointed because I know I can do better but I'm not discouraged. I've picked up plenty of tips and useful information that will help to make my game better. I feel I've gotten to know my own game much better. I know now the points that I'll have to practice most. I'll play the final round of 18 holes today but wouldn't be leaving for home until Saturday. This tournament has been a great experience for me.

Tournament Not Failure; St. George Finishes 24th, June 29th, 1960

HALIFAX - I finished 24th in the 61 entries in the Nova Scotia Open Golf Championship. In the fourth and final round yesterday I had a 77 to run my total for the 72 holes to 310 which was 31 strokes behind the winner. But my entering in the Tournament wasn't a failure. A 72, five-over-par by John Monroe, a Pro from North Sydney, had him finishing with a 279 to take a slim one stroke victory over Peter Hope of Dartmouth. Hope, who won the Tournament last year, ended with 280 as he had 75 yesterday.

A good friend that I made acquaintance while in the tournament, amateur Peter Doig, was third with 282. I plan to have a round at Ashburn Course here on Friday with Doig before I leave for home on Saturday. While I finished 24th, my 310 was only eight behind Jimmy Locke of Windsor with 302. With Doig taking third, the fourth spot went to George Gilmurray with 284. Rex Joudrey and Haddie Morash had 285 for the next place.

Yesterday's 18 holes went in the same manner as the first three rounds. My troubles were once again on the front nine. I had a 40 on a par 33. On the back nine, which is par 34, I had 37. I opened well on the back nine with a par three on the tenth, eleventh and twelfth but went out of bounds on the thirteenth for a two-over-par six. On the seventeenth hole I had trouble getting off a rock bed and went two-over-par with another six. A birdie on the fifteenth hole took one off the four-over-par strokes for my 37 finish. I was par on the fourteenth,

sixteenth and the eighteenth holes.

I leave for Brightwood, Nova Scotia today for a couple of rounds of golf at the course there before coming back here to Halifax on Friday. My plane, for home, is scheduled to leave early Saturday morning so I'll have time for a round with Peter Doig on Friday. Of course I'm disappointed with my showing but the tips and pointers that I've picked up keep the trip from being a failure. This tournament and the experience I picked up, will I believe, cause a general improvement in my game. I know the more important aspects of my game that I have to practice.

Watch And Wait Pro, Monroe Sees Amateurs Slip, Cops First, June 29th, 1960
Bally Haly Pro St. George is 24th

HALIFAX - Young North Sydney Professional John "Jock" Monroe played a waiting game at Ashburn Wednesday and it paid off big dividends as he nailed down the Nova Scotia Open Golf Championship. Monroe, who fired a par 67 and a 68 Tuesday to pull up among the contenders, played cautious golf most of the way in yesterday's 18 hole finale, waited for amateurs Peter Hope of Brightwood and Peter Doig of Ashburn to crack, and then wheeled in to lift the MacCulloch Trophy and top prize money of \$250.00. His card, yesterday, read 72 and that gave him a 72 hole total of 279 - one stroke better than Hope who had led over the first 54 holes and three better than Doig. Hope had a 75 yesterday and Doig a 73.

Newfoundland Professional Eric St. George, of Bally Haly, St. John's, playing his first major tournament - toured the Ashburn layout in 77 yesterday to finish with a respectable 310. That was good for 24th place in the 61 player field and put him ahead of a goodly number of tourney veterans. Among the Pros, George Gilmurray took second money with a 284 that left him fourth in the overall standings. Veteran Cecil Dowling of Charlottetown pocketed third Pro money and was seventh in the tourney at 288.

Monroe, who turned Pro in 1958 after winning the Provincial amateur, took his first Open victory. He was runner-up in 1958 and took the runner-up slot in 1959 behind Hope. However, while he was second in last year's tournament, he was low Pro, so this is the second straight year in which he picked up top prize money. After some sizzling second day rounds, the field settled down to cautious "let the other guy make the mistakes" golf and consequently nobody even sniffed par 67. A pair of Ashburn amateurs - veterans Ed Joudrey and Harold "Hattie" Morash - clicked for 71's to move into third and fourth spots among the amateurs with 285 and 286 respectively. Those 71's shared low scoring honors for the day with Bryson Cowell and Winsor Pro, Jimmy Locke.

Though scoring was relatively high, the round played by the top threesome was dramatic and tense all the way. By the sixth hole of the round all were tied for the tourney lead with 231's. Hope regained the lead on seven but Monroe bounced ahead with a birdie on the eighth hole while Hope and Doig bogeyed. At the end of nine, Monroe shows a 35 for 242 on the tourney. Hope had fired a 38 for 243 and Doig a one over par 34 for 243. A double bogey on 11 just about tossed Doig out of the running. On 13 Monroe potted a tremendous birdie to wrest the lead 257 and after that he never faltered. He took a two-stroke lead on 15 but Hope sliced it on 17 and that's the way it finished.

Doig got off to a blazing start dunking a bird on a six foot putt after a tremendous approach. Hope and Monroe parred two where Doig ran into trouble. He flubbed his approach and was forced to take a bogey five. They all bogeyed three. Some stellar shot-making came on four. Doig's drive on the 345 yard hole was down the middle and his approach 25 feet from the pin. He sank the putt for a birdie three. Hope sliced well off to the left, he played an approach to near the pin, missed an eight foot putt but got out with his par. Monroe was short on his drive. Over the pin on his approach and two putted.

Hope found big trouble on five. With a brisk cross wind, his tee shot looped out of bounds to the left - costing him two strokes. He made a good approach on his provisional ball and sank a 10-footer for a bogey five. Doig was just short from the tee, chipped to within a foot and sank the putt for a birdie. Monroe was on in two and two putted. It was a tied tournament on six. Hope again hit a vicious hook that spiraled off to the left, almost to number 17 fairway. He recovered on his second shot almost to the green and chipped on, but he two putted for a five while Doig and Monroe collected four's.

Hope was ahead again on the seventh with a par but a bird on the eighth pushed Monroe out front. On the 155 yard hole, Monroe drove to the green and sank a 25 foot putt for the birdie. That putt hesitated for a second on the rim before dropping. Doig missed on a five foot putt and took a par three while Hope missed a 30 footer by a hair, missed again from six feet out and took a four. After that he stayed tight until the 13th. Monroe's long tee shot put him just below the hill that hides the green on the 320 yard hole. He lofted his approach close to the pin, made good on the putt for the birdie three and was in control.

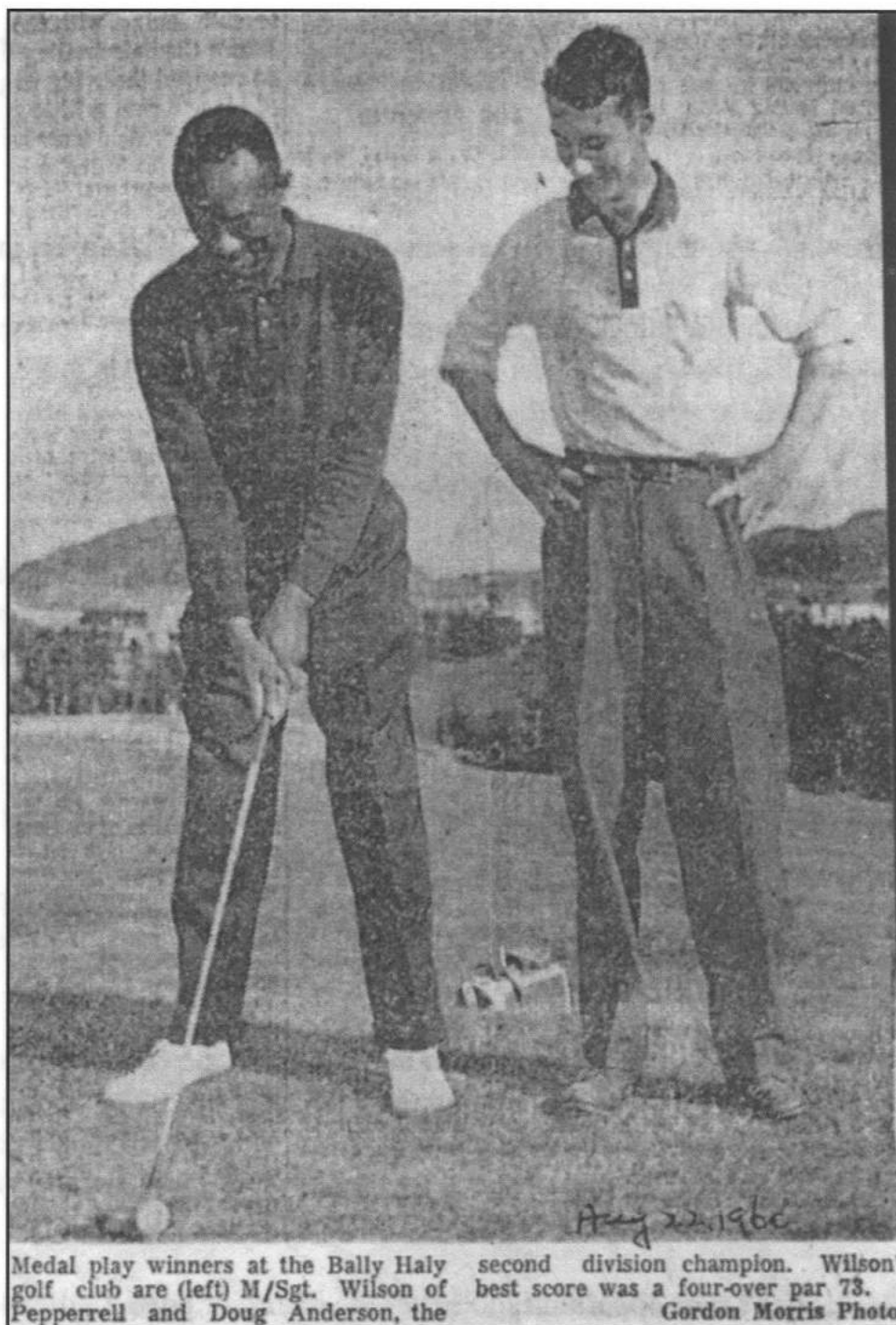

Caddies Have Their Day, August 29th, 1960

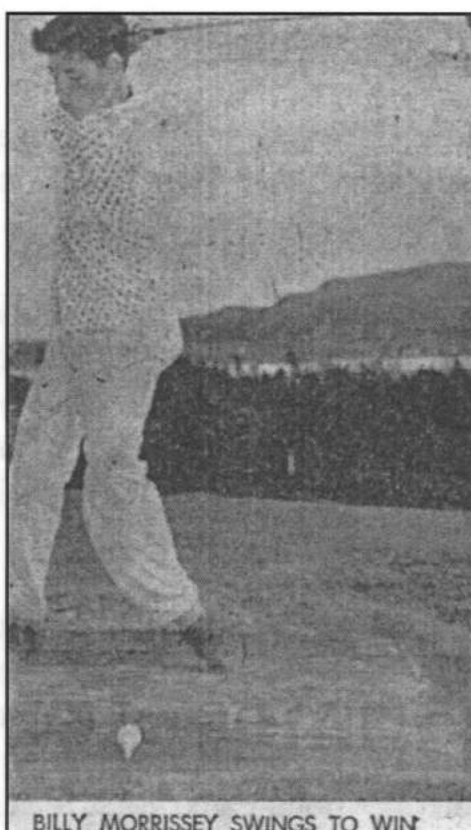

But they really learn the game, according to Bally Haly Pro Lloyd Chancey, by watching the best senior players perform, and then "sneaking on the course" and trying all the tricks they've seen. "The boys ... they develop a good, natural swing because they're young," says Chancey, "and they can copy the good players."

No one was near Billy in the first class showdown as he won for the second year in a row. Keith Holwell who came second, shot a 92. The other two classes played only the back nine holes. DeBourke, 15, had 41 for the par 34 course. He has a handicap of 11.

Pro Chancey would like to see more players of junior age out learning the game, but he stresses that golf is a game that requires constant practice. "You have to play everytime you get a chance," he says. "It's a long, hard struggle" he points out, "but if you don't have a new crop coming on all the time, then you can't expect good golf."

There are about one-half dozen school students and eight to ten university men in the Golf Club now. They play until they can qualify for the Second division match and medal play competitions. Right now, the best prospects are 18 year old Doug Anderson and Ray Halley, who's 16. Anderson, winner of the match play with scores of 88 and 82, has carded a best score of 79 while Halley's top is 81. The two play together almost all the time and are out on the course often.

St. John's Ladies' Lead Golf, August 30th, 1960

The City gals are hosting the 10-member defending championship team from Grand Falls. The central papertown club copped the Bowring Trophy in a tournament last season at Grand Falls. St. John's won the first year it was up for competition on their home ground in 1957.

The hometowners stroked off with the visitors in the doubles matches Tuesday afternoon and of the five matches played the hosts captured the complete slate. The 10-member teams, paired off in fours, two for each club, to cover the 18 hole course. Mrs. Ambrose (Tessa) Shea swung the hottest club for the day's action. Three tied title golf...

But only one could win

A tired favorite with a dwindling lead, the cool confident veteran, and a young golfer with a burning desire to win, found themselves doing battle on the last green of a 72-hole tournament, and no champion decided.

It had built up into a dramatic climax for the first annual Newfoundland Golf Championship, and Dr. Duncan Rice was not going to keep an anxious gallery waiting much longer.

The veteran golfer and men's captain at Bally Haly eliminated the young Billy Morrissey, and then tackled the stylish Jim Sterling Sunday afternoon and after 72 holes of competition and six playoff holes, stroked his way to the '64 Newfoundland Amateur title.

It was an almost unbelievable finish to a successful tournament which marked the first year of the Newfoundland Golf Association.

Rice had started the final round of the tournament in second place and trailing the pace setter Sterling by five strokes. Sterling had widened the gap by one with just the back nine to go, and 20-year-old Bill Morrissey was considered out of play, 12 strokes off the pace.

But golf is a game of breaks and inches, misses and memories.

Morrissey started the final nine holes as if he had just found his own clubs. He parred No. 10 while Sterling had a six and Rice a 5, and then gained another stroke on Sterling and two on Rice with a par 3 for the 11th hole. His 265-yard drive on No. 12 set the stage for a beautiful birdie 3, and with the long No. 13 looking at them, he was now eight behind Sterling and two back of Rice.

The 13th hole had a special significance for the young golfer. He had lost a two-stroke penalty for hitting the unattended pin from 59 feet out on the third round, and it was later to cost him the title.

But just two swings of the club and Sterling found himself with just a four-stroke lead on Morrissey, and two on Dr. Rice. He tried to push his shot on the fairway, but was out of bounds twice for a four-stroke penalty.

The match was wide open!

Morrissey continued to set the pace and passed Rice on No. 15. He caught Sterling on the 18th hole, but Rice rallied for a birdie 4 and the Newfoundland tourney was tied with three scores of 314.

Sterling and Morrissey each shot 4's on the first hole of the playoff, while Rice found himself in the rear again with a poor 6.

But the key play of the tournament was waiting on No. 2. Morrissey was in the woods off the tee and double bogeyed for a 7, and Sterling played safe for a par 5 to take a comfortable lead. But Rice was the master of the lot. His second shot rolled just 15 feet from the pin and lay in exactly the same lie as Sterling had played in the third round.

"I had watched Jim closely when he eagled the hole earlier in the day," Rice later explained. "He used a right-to-left borrow so that it rolled to the left. And it worked a second time!"

The beautiful putt drew a tremendous ovation from over 50 spectators, and it was now a two-man match. Morrissey gallantly tried to get back into competition by sinking a 35-foot chip shot on No. 3 for a birdie, but a pair of pars left the championship undecided and Sterling and Rice still tied.

Rice drove beautifully off No. 4 tee, but the pace had long gotten to Sterling. After 12 miles of walking and over 200 hit balls, he was in trouble from the start of the final playoff and fell back two strokes for a 14 total compared to 12 for the champion.

Sterling had entered the second day of competition with a 149 total on excellent scores of 72 and 77, and was the conceded favorite to take the first amateur title. Rice was second with 156, with Morrissey third at 154 and Ray Halley fourth with 159.

Three-year veteran Don Dooley, fast becoming one of the club's top golfers, overtook the leading field on the final day with the best scores of 77, 77. He edged into the fourth place spot by one stroke over Doug Brown who had a total of 318.

Rice, Sterling, Morrissey and Dooley will now make up the Newfoundland team that will travel to the Dominion competition in Saskatoon.

While the major attraction of the first tournament was being focused on the amateur division, a favorite and a surprise contender was taking the other two divisions.

Stu Ayre, twice Bally Haly Match Champion but recently just a casual golfer, shot rounds of 83 and 86 to defeat the top ranking Wilf Peters by one stroke in the senior section.

Ayre, who had a 68 score back five years ago, was playing only his third and fourth complete rounds of the year.

In third place was Len Oliver, back in St. John's for his vacation and playing as a guest. He carded scores of 84 and 91 for a 175 total. The fourth place finisher was veteran golfer Harry Conroy. He was 181 on scores of 88 and 93.

★ ★ ★

The Morrissey family had one champion for the day as 17-year-old Gerry led from the first tee and claimed the junior title in convincing fashion. He had a pair of 86's for the first two rounds and then got down to 84 and 82 for a very respectable 338 total. His nearest competitor was Keith Rose with a 351 total.

In third place on the juniors was Denis House with a 375 score, while Eric Heddle was fourth on 380.

★ ★ ★

Of the 65 golfers that started the tournament in all sections, there were ten dropouts over the two days. The biggest surprise was the no-return score of Fred Davis in the amateur division. Davis was the top favorite after shooting 72, 73 and 74 last week, but had an 83 for the first round and a 45 for the front nine on the second nine. He failed to enter his score and withdrew from the competition.

During the first annual NGA tournament, the scores and communications were kept up to date by the Ladies' Association. They did a terrific job of keeping the records, and also provided refreshments for the competitors. The official starter and co-ordinator was club pro Bobby Barr, while Herb Feder was the chairman of the Rule Committee.

Bally Haly's Assistant Golf Pro, Eric St. George, will compete in his first tournament activity in three years when he travels to Toronto for the 1964 MacNaughton Brooks Bursary. In his initial trip in 1960 he placed 24th in a field of 61 golfers.

September 1st, 1964

Wing Commander Col. Walter Lucas of Goose Bay chats informally with members of the visiting Bally Haly golf team and golfers from the American Base. The City golfers were at Goose Bay for an Invitational Tournament with the Americans traveling to St. John's for return rounds on Sunday and Monday.

This marked the first time Bally Haly and the American Air Force Base at Goose Bay have exchanged visits for an Invitational Tournament. The Bally Haly team journeyed to the American Base at Goose Bay last Friday and played rounds on Friday and Saturday. Both teams returned to St. John's and played at Bally Haly on Sunday and Monday. Bally Haly won the match competitions. Members of the Bally Haly team were: Doug Brown, Don Dooley, Sam Baker, Bob Hudson, Reg Godden, Dr. Duncan Rice, Bobby Barr and Bud Bragg. The eight man team scored seven points on the final round while the visiting golfers managed a pair. Bally Haly had won the previous three rounds.

The Americans have built a six hole course and are playing golf for the first time at Goose Bay. During the visit to Bally Haly Captain Bob Mulloy carded a fine score on his two rounds. The R.C.A.F. officer shot rounds of 74 and 75. At Goose Bay, local golfer, Doug Brown, shot 64 for eighteen holes.

"We hope to make this an annual affair," Bally Haly Men's Captain, Dr. Duncan Rice said. The '64 Newfoundland Champion was high on praise for the success of the weekend exchange visit and looks forward to a similar tournament, on a larger scale, next season.

September 10th, 1964

But the big news, as far as Newfoundland is concerned, is that Don finished a most impressive second in the Third Division with scores of 82 and 81. The Third Division was for players with a handicap from 8 to 11. Dooley's net score was 141.

The winner in Dooley's division was Dean Saltaman of Chester, Nova Scotia. He had scores of 77 and 71 for 148 and a net score of 132.

September 28th, 1964

Renouf and Johnson meet in Match Play Finals.

The 1964 golf season at Bally Haly will enter its final stages this week. After one of the Club's most successful seasons only two championships remain on the schedule. Jack Renouf and Don Johnson, two of the better golfers at Bally Haly, will match shots on a 36 hole competition sometime this week for the Club's Match Play Championship. The other tournament scheduled for Saturday is the Tournament of Champions. This is the first time for this event and it will be an eighteen hole Medal Play Handicap Competition. It will feature the winners of the various tournaments held throughout the season.

Recapping the series for the past week ... there have been six championships declared. In the Club's Second Division, Jeff Peters claimed his first title when he defeated Hector Price in a 36 hole battle. Peters was seeded in the tournament and won matches from Herb Feder and Doug Brown to make the finals. Price eliminated H. B. Murphy and Seamus O'Regan for the finals bid. The Second Division is for golfers with a handicap 19 to 27, inclusive, and various rounds are played from June to September until there are just two golfers remaining.

The 36 hole match for the title will be played on the first fine day. Renouf who is a seven handicap player should receive a stiff match from Johnson, a veteran at the game, who plays consistent golf and has a handicap of ten.

Four other executive officers were elected as well, they are: Mrs. Alec Hickman, Mrs. Gordon Winter, Mrs. Ray Bartlett and Mrs. Steve Herder.

The Club will open for practice games November 5th ... the official opening will be November 14th, 1964.

The promising young golfer held off a final day drive by Keith Rose of St. John's who finished with 332.

Defending champion Gerry Morrissey of St. John's won the first junior tournament last year with a 72-hole score of 338. A total of 10 golfers teed off in the tournament — eight of them from the host Bally Haly Golf and Country Club in St. John's.

Winners of the provincial play-downs will represent Newfoundland at the Willingdon Cup to be played in Montreal in August.

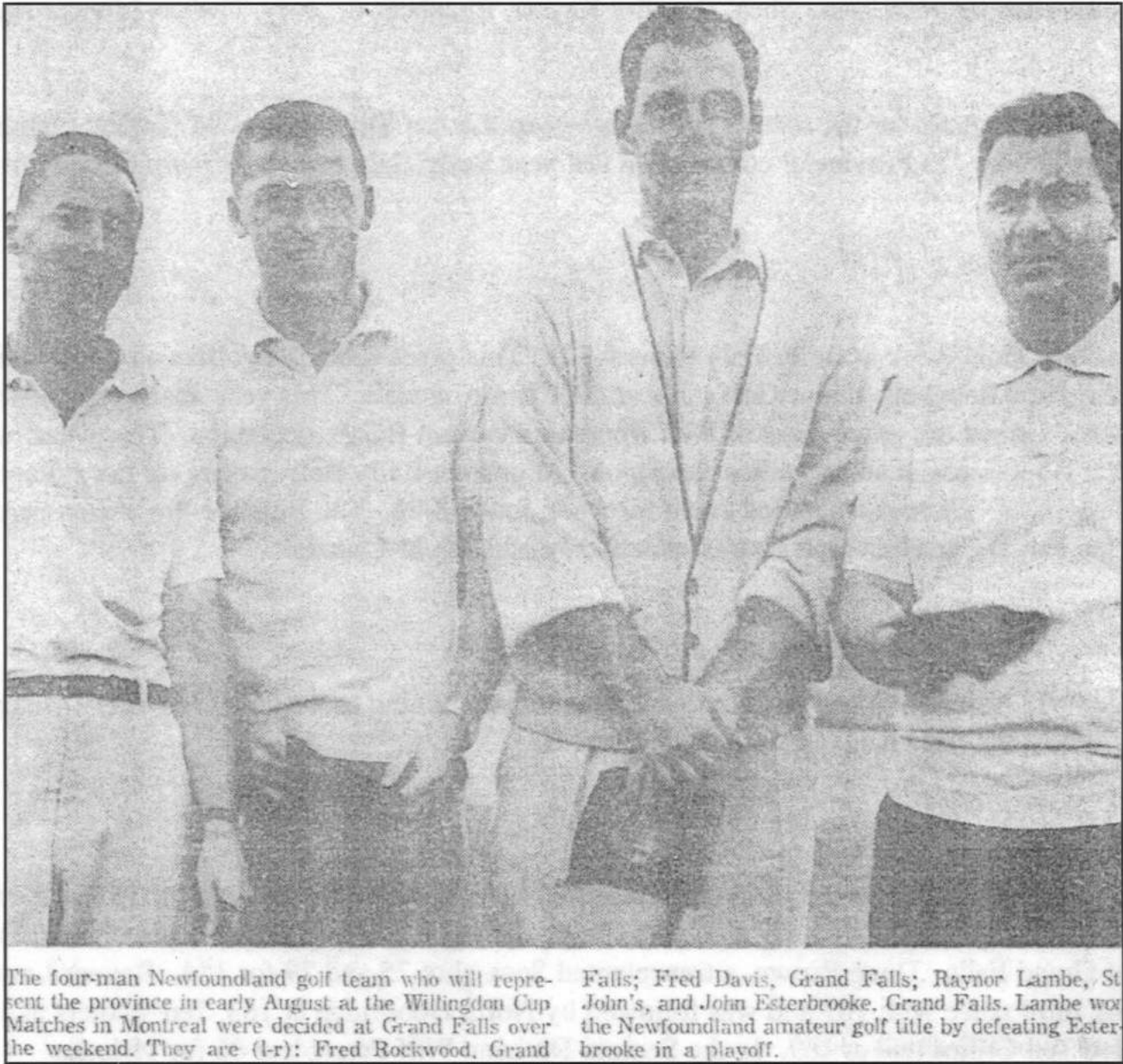
LAMB TAKES PROVINCIAL GOLF TITLE

He battled back and capped his tremendous surge with a startling eagle on the final hole.

Up to that point he and Estabrooks had exchanged the lead several times but Copeland came through with the important shots when he needed them most, in the clutch.

Copeland, down two shots as late as the 68th hole, got one back on the 69th, halved the 70th, picked up another on the 71st and went into the final hole even with the long-hitting Estabrooks.

GRAND FALLS (Staff) — Peter Stirling lives in Gander and has to commute 60 miles to the nearest course in Grand Falls to play his golf. But travelling proved to be no handicap as Stirling stood off a strong closing charge by Corner Brook's Bob Hicks Friday to win the Newfoundland junior golf championship here in the central Newfoundland papertown.

Stirling had a 72-hole total of 327, five strokes better than Hicks who shot a 37 on the front nine Friday for the best nine-hole score of the two day tournament. Hicks had a final round 78, matching the 78 shot by Stirling in the opening round for the top 18-hole score.

On Thursday the first round 78 gave Stirling a five stroke lead over Eoin O'Brien of Corner Brook and seven strokes on Hicks. The young Gander golfer had an 81 on the second round, O'Brien also had an 81 to remain five strokes behind but Hicks went up to 88 and trailed by 14 strokes going into Friday's play.

Hicks had an 81 in the Friday morning round to pick up four strokes while Stirling and O'Brien settled for 85's. In the final round Friday afternoon, O'Brien ballooned to a 93 and dropped to fifth place while Hicks added a 41 on the back nine for his 78 while Stirling held his lead with an 83 although Hicks closed the margin to five strokes by the time the tournament ended.

Charlie Elton and Keith Rose, both of St. John's passed O'Brien in the final round and finished third and fourth respectively. Elton finished at 338, six strokes behind Hicks and Rose came in at 340. Record field of 120 golfers

Morrissey crowned champ in invitational tourney

"This sure makes up for the one I lost in 1964," said a jubilant Bill Morrissey Sunday night after being crowned champ in the second annual Newfoundland Invitational Golf Tournament held at Bally Haly.

A record field of 120 golfers from the Blomidon Club, Corner Brook; Grand Falls Golf Club; Indian Head Club, Stephenville; Tarrasac Club, Labrador City and Bally Haly took to the greens Saturday and Sunday but the 25 - year - old Morrissey took the championship and the Bank of Montreal Trophy by finishing the 36 - hole tourney with a 149 total. He shot a fine 73 score for the first 18 holes Saturday and carded a 76 over the final 18 Sunday to finish three strokes ahead of Peter Stirling of Grand Falls and Roy Bungay of Corner Brook who tied for second with 152 totals.

"This is the first major trophy I've ever won and I'm very pleased I was able to win it, especially after what happened in 1964," explained Morrissey, who has been golfing for almost 12 years.

In the 1964 Newfoundland Amateur, Bill said he was 10 strokes behind the leaders with just nine holes left to play in the tournament. But he made a tremendous comeback to tie Dr. Duncan Rice and Jim Stirling for first place, only to lose out in a three - hole championship playoff.

Describing his play in the invitational, Morrissey said, "The first game (18 holes) I played on Saturday I played real well while today in my second game I played it cautious for the last nine holes."

The two runners - up were three strokes off the pace set by Morrissey. Stirling had identical 76's for his 152 total while Bungay had a 78 for the first 18 holes but came back strong in the second day of play and shot a fine 74. Cyril Furlong of Bally Haly took third place honors with a 153 total on 75 - 80 scores while teammate Dr. Duncan Rice finished fourth. He had scores of 72, best in the two day tournament, and 82 for a 154 total.

In second division play Kevin Murphy of Bally Haly took top honors by finishing with a 169 total. Murphy carded an 85 for the first 18 holes and shot an 84 in his second game for his 169 total. Reg Dean, also of Bally Haly, was runner - up with a 170 on scores of 84 - 86 while two other Bally Haly players, Jerry Ayre and Bob Cole, tied for third with identical 172 totals. Ayre had scores of 86 - 86 while Cole shot 87 in his first game and 85 over the last 18 holes.

Andy Rose made it three titles for Bally Haly when he topped top honors in the third division. Rose had scores of 90 - 103 to finish with a 196 total for a big five - stroke lead over runner - up Wally Long, also of Bally Haly. Long shot a 106 on his first 18 holes but came on much stronger over the final 18 posting a 96. Kevin Walsh of Stephenville and Art King of Bally Haly tied for third with 202 totals. Both had 107 - 95 scores.

Last Year's invitational champion, John Estabrooks of Grand Falls, wasn't entered this year as he is now living in New Brunswick.

With the invitational now over, all attention turns to the Newfoundland Amateur to be held in Grand Falls from July 11 - 14. The winner of the amateur automatically gets a berth on the Willingdon Cup team that will represent the province in the Canadian championships in August. The other three positions will be filled by golfers with the best combined aggregate scores from the invitational and the amateur.

Golfers from Bally Haly won the the Seabord Construction team trophy at the Newfoundland Invitational. July 4

Invitational champion Bill Morrissey turned in back to back scores of 69 on the par 70 course. The most impressive fact was that both rounds were played on the same day.

Peters, Stirling junior golf champs

CORNER BROOK (Staff)—Janet Peters of Bally Haly in St. John's and Peter Stirling of the Grand Falls Golf Club did just what the experts predicted Friday night and repeated as champions in the Newfoundland Junior Golf Championships at the Blomidon course.

Miss Peters, formerly of Corner Brook, saw her game sky-rocket to 101 but still won by a comfortable 11-stroke margin over Jennifer Jackman of Grand Falls.

Stirling, who picked up his third straight title, turned in a pair of steady rounds Friday after falling behind David Oxford by three strokes after Thursday's opening day of play.

Stirling, a second place finisher in the Newfoundland Amateur last week shot 74 Friday morning in his first 18 holes and finished up Friday night with a 77 to win by seven strokes over Oxford.

The 18-year-old Stirling was behind 160-157 in favor of Oxford after 36 holes Thursday. He shot 35, the lowest score of the tournament, on the front nine Friday morning and came home with a 39 for a 74 and a three stroke lead over Oxford after 54 holes. Oxford had a 39-41 showing for an 80 Friday morning.

Friday afternoon, the lead exchanged hands once again following the front nine of the final 18 holes. Oxford 17, shot a fine 37 and Stirling dropped to a 41, pushing Oxford into the lead again by one stroke.

The final nine holes of the tournament were a disaster for Oxford, as Stirling took eight strokes from him to win by seven. On the 14th David took a seven, three over par, and

from then on it was all Stirling. Oxford finished with a 44 for an 81 round and Stirling tucked his third straight title away with a 36, to show 77 for the final 18 holes.

Stirling completed the two day, 72-hole tournament with a 311 total. Oxford tallied 318 and third spot went to Roger Dean of Grand Falls. Oxford, however, took the low net award. He finished with a 278 net.

Miss Peters, who won her title last year at Grand Falls, was ahead by 13 strokes after the opening day of play. Janet scored rounds of 40-45 for an 85 and Miss Jackman, who won the title in 1967 and took low net last year, had a 98.

Jennifer topped Miss Peters by two strokes in Friday's final 18 holes, but Janet had built up a comfortable lead in the early round to coast home with the title.

Janet scored 57 on the front nine and 44 on the back nine. Friday, Miss Jackman increased her previous day score by one stroke with a 99, on rounds of 49 and 50.

Janet finished the 36 holes with a 186 total. Miss Jackman scored 198.

Daphne Cant of Bally Haly placed third with a 220 total. Gertrude Delancy and Helen Rockwood of Grand Falls scored 236 and 238 respectively, and Gillian Grand of the Harmon Club in Stephenville had a 249 total.

Miss Cant and Miss Peters shared the low net with 148 each. Dean, another early favorite, finished strong in Friday's play after firing rounds of 86 and 81 Thursday.

Dean carded an 81 Friday morning and moved into third

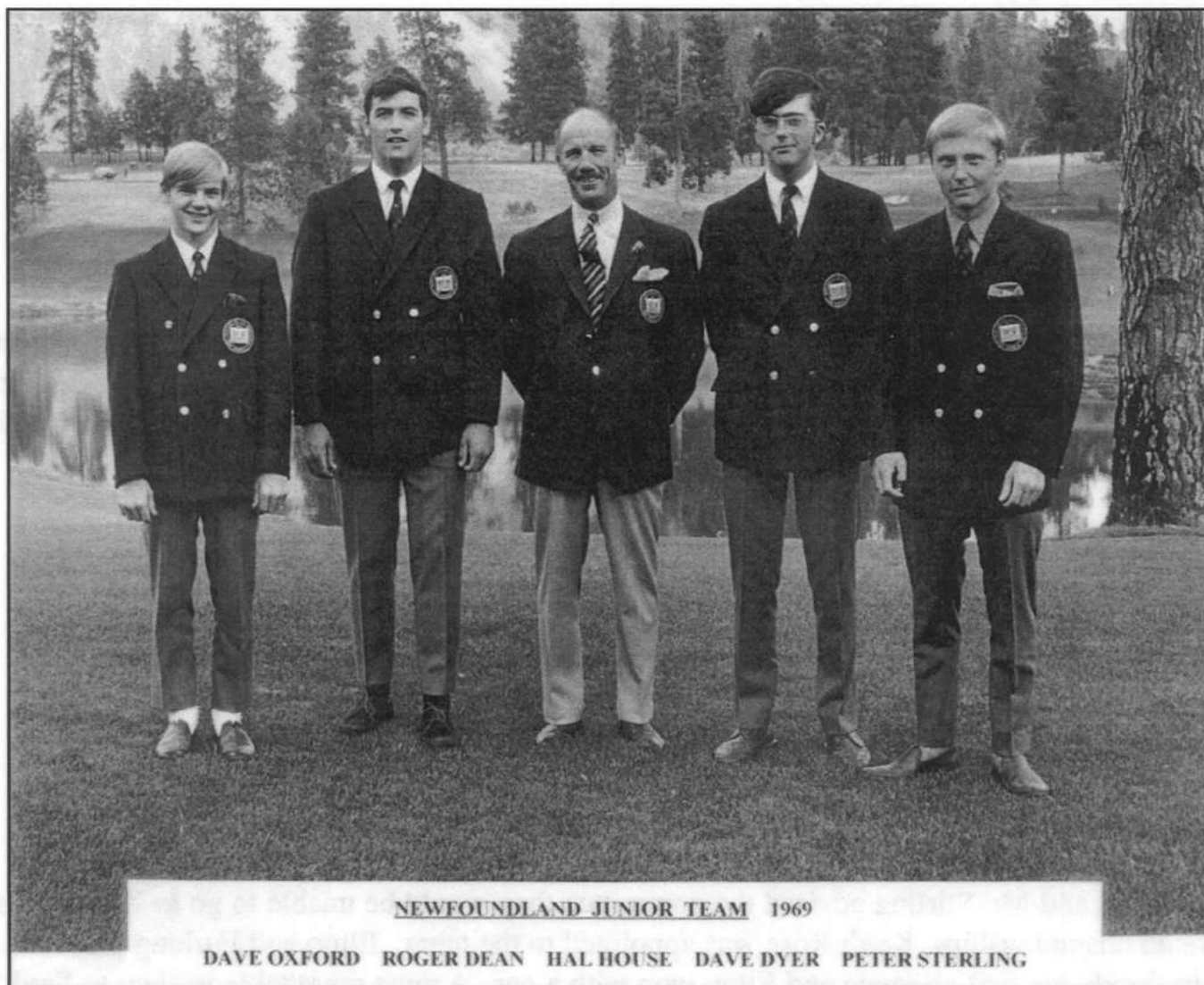

EZINICKI BREEZES TO OPEN TITLE

SEPTEMBER 10 TO 13

If you had to choose one word to describe the play of Bill Ezinicki in the first Newfoundland Open golf tournament it would have to be consistent. It was the 45 year old Ezinicki's consistent play that helped him to the championship and the main prize of \$1500 in the Open which started Thursday at Bally Haly and concluded Saturday. Ezinicki, playing pro at the New Seabury Golf Club in Cape Cod, Mass., fired a one under par 67 in the opening round, came in with an identical score for the second round and with gale force winds sweeping across the course on Saturday he carded a 69 to finish with a 54 hole total of 203, one under par for the tourney.

The former NHLer had a five stroke lead over Bruce Dobie of Worcester, Mass., heading into the final round. Dobie cut three strokes off Ezinicki's lead after the first three holes but he triple bogied on the par 4 4th hole, dropped back to five strokes behind and never was close again. Ezinicki started out the last round with a bogie on #1 and a double bogie on #3 but after that he improved with each hole. He fired a 38 on the front nine and had the gallery of almost 300 spectators watching in amazement as he carded a 31 on the back nine.

In taking first place and the championship Black Horse Trophy, Ezinicki finished 11 strokes ahead of runner-up Jay Dolan. Playing out of Leichester, Mass., Dolan finished with a three round total of 214, one stroke better than Dobie who came in third. Dolan fired a 67 in the opening round to tie Ezinicki for the lead but dropped back to 73 and a 74. One stroke cost Dobie \$125 in the tourney. He was tied for second with Dolan at the start of the 18th hole but while Dolan one putt to par the hole, Dobie had to two putt for a bogie. For taking second Dolan received \$750 while third place brought Dobie \$500. If Dobie had parred the last hole they would have split the second and third place money or \$625 each.

Tied for third spot among the pros were Finn Sorensen of Belvedere Club in Edmonton, Alberta and Kelly Burnett of the Ashburn Club in Halifax, Nova Scotia with 220 totals and won \$375 each. In the Open there was also an extra \$1,000 purse for members of the Canadian Professional Golf Association only and Sorensen and Burnett also split another \$375. The next money winners were all Canadian pros and as well as winning their share of the Open purse also added a few extra dollars from the \$1,000 CPGA purse.

Phil Giroux of Montreal, Quebec was fifth at the end of the tourney with a 221 total and earned \$450. Jim Baxter of Amherst, Nova Scotia and George Arnold of the Thunderbird Club in Toronto, Ontario tied for seventh with 223 and collected \$337.50 each. Tied for ninth at 224 were John Monroe of the Abercrombie Club in Amherst, Nova Scotia and Herb Holzschietter of the Thunderbird Club and they earned \$212.50.

While most of the interest in the Open was centered around the pros, the amateurs made a fine showing with Newfoundland's provincial junior champ, Peter Stirling of Grand Falls and Charlie Elton of Bally Haly leading the way. Stirling fired identical 76's for the first two rounds and carded an 80 for the third to finish with a 232 total, one stroke better than Elton. Rayner Lamb of Corner Brook was leading after the second round after turning in two 75's but he fell back to an 86 in the last round and finished with a 236 score, tied for third with Dr. George Grant of Stephenville. Fifth place went to Bill Morrissey of Bally Haly with 238.

As a result of winning the amateur section, Stirling received a medal affixed in a trophy especially designed for it as well as prizes for the first low gross and the second low net. A total of nine gross prizes and 15 handicap prizes were presented to the amateurs. The Newfoundland Open concluded on Saturday night at Bally Haly with a presentation of prizes and this was followed by a good old Newfoundland Soiree which was thoroughly enjoyed by all the visiting golfers.

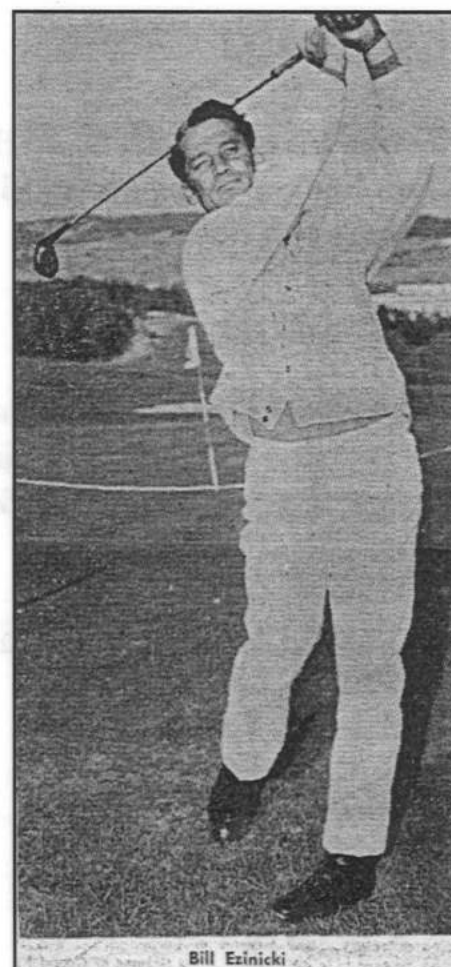

"Everything worked out better than expected and from the comments I've received from all the pros we won't have any trouble getting them back next year. The only trouble we might have is getting too many entries and not knowing what to do with them all," he concluded.

Bill Ezinicki is in Boston today playing in the New England Professional Golfers Association golf tournament but more than likely he's still thinking about his victory in the Newfoundland Open on Saturday and the splendid time he had here during his first trip to the province. Ezinicki captured the championship Black Horse Trophy and the \$1500 first prize as he headed a field of 32 pros over the 54 hole, three day tournament at Bally Haly. The 45 year old ended 11 strokes ahead of runner-up Jay Dolan and 12 ahead of Bruce Dobie.

"I had a five stroke lead over Bruce heading into the final 18 holes but I started with bogie on #1 and a double bogie on #2 before I got in the groove and started to play well," explained Bill. "When Bruce started to catch up on the first three holes I knew I had to play well to stay ahead. The wind affected my game a bit and I was cautious starting out."

When Dobie started to close in it didn't worry the former NHLer very much as he explained that he just concentrates on playing the course and not his opponents.

From the comments passed by all visiting golfers the first Newfoundland Open was a big success and was enjoyed by all and Bill was one of the first to agree on both counts. "The people here were great. The tournament was well received and people responded more as the tournament progressed. 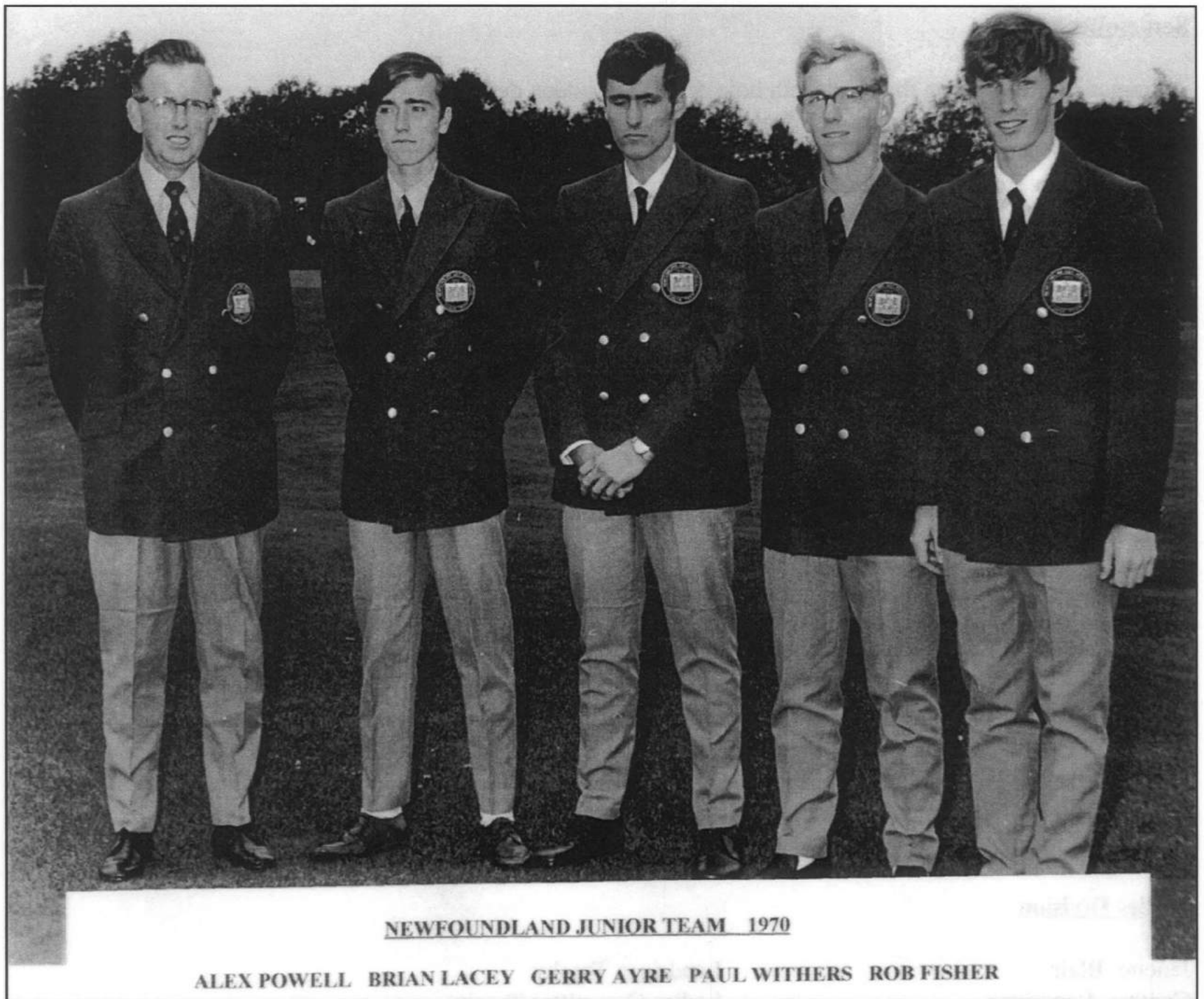

Defending champ holds three-stroke lead

Shooting for second straight Amateur

Cyril Furlong of the host Bally Haly Golf Club in St. John's plans to play it safe today as he goes after his second straight Newfoundland Amateur title.

The 25-year-old Furlong fired a two-under par 68 in Saturday's opening round of the three-day 54-hole tourney and although slipping back to 78 Sunday his 146 total gives him a three-stroke lead over runners-up Peter Stirling of Grand Falls and Roy Bungay of Harmon.

"I'll be playing for par Monday," stated Furlong after Sunday's second round. "This is no time to gamble unless I get behind."

Furlong said he feels there are four other golfers close behind him who could win the title just as easily but Cyril is intent on winning his second straight championship and an automatic berth on Newfoundland's Willingdon Cup team.

"The amateur title is the one everybody wants to take and I'd like very much to make it two in a row," he said. "Besides its about the only way I'll be able to make the Willingdon Cup team after my poor showing in the June Invitational in Corner Brook last month."

Furlong had a 54-hole total of 251. The winner of the amateur automatically receives a berth on the team while the other three team members come from the best combined scores in the Amateur and June Invitational.

In the seniors' tournament, for golfers 50 years of age and over, veteran Doug Brown

of Bally Haly made his debut a successful one as he walked off with top honors after firing a 152 score.

The seniors' event is a 36-hole affair and Brown, who won the Amateur in 1965, turned in a strong performance by carding identical 76 scores in the two-day competition.

Defending seniors' champ Jim Clarkston of the Tamarac Golf Club in Labrador City, was runner-up with a 159 gross score on individual rounds of 79-80. Lew Andrews of the Blomidon club in Corner Brook and Bruce Edge of Bally Haly tied for third with identical 175 totals. Andrews had rounds of 88-87 while Edge fired an 85 in the opening round but slipped back to a 90 on Sunday.

H.O. House of Blomidon was fourth with 178 (87-91) and veteran Harry Conroy of Bally Haly fifth with a 182 total (84-96).

Furlong was at his best in the opening round but wasn't too pleased with his play Sunday especially on the ninth and 15th hole.

"They key was the ninth and 15th hole today," said Furlong. "I was in good shape until I hit bad shots on both these holes and it cost me a double bogle (6) on both."

Stirling carded a 74 score for the opening round and dropped back one stroke in the second round for his 149 total. He was pleased with his play and said, "if I can hit the ball Monday as well as I have the last two days then I think I can win it."

Bungay was runner-up to Furlong after the opening round with a 73 but he had to settle for a 76 in the second and a tie for the

runner-up position with Stirling.

Raynor Lamb of Bally Haly and June Invitational champ Bill Morrissey hold down third spot with 159 totals. Lamb fired identical 75's while Morrissey had a 76 Saturday and chopped two strokes off Sunday. Seven strokes back of the leader is Dick Tallman of Bally Haly with a 153 total and he's followed by Ron Moore of Harmon, 154; Dr. Duncan Rice, Bally Haly, 155; and John LeDrew, Blomidon — Paul Withers, Bally Haly — and Gerry Boland, Harmon with identical 156 scores.

Fred Stagg of the Harmon Club is the B division (13-25 handicappers) leader with a 36-hole gross score of 168. He carded individual rounds of 81-87 and holds a two-stroke lead over runner-up John Ballard of Bally Haly who had scores of 86-84. Butch Barron of Harmon is one stroke back in third (88-83) while George Wyatt of Bally Haly is fourth on a 172 total (88-84).

In C division, Chas Hutton of the host club is the leader with a 189 gross score on individual rounds of 93-96 and he holds a nine-stroke lead over runner-up Ken Oakley, also of Bally Haly. Oakley shot rounds of 101-97 and he leads clubmate Gordon Burton by two strokes. Burton turned in rounds of 99-101.

Morrissey holds a commanding 18-stroke lead in the battle to decide the Willingdon Cup team. He has a four round total of 370 while John LeDrew of Blomidon is runner-up with a 388 total. John's brother, Gerry, and Stirling

are tied for third with identical 391 totals and they're followed by Lamb, 392; Furlong, 397; Moore and Bungay, 400; Boland and Tallman, 402; Dave Oxford of Blomidon, 403, and Don Dooley of Bally Haly, 405.

The Newfoundland Golf Association held its annual general meeting Sunday at Bally Haly and reports presented for the past year showed the association made great progress especially in the areas of improved calibre and increased participating in provincial tournament, as evidenced by the record 150 entries in the amateur, as well as in junior golf.

One of the reasons for the increased interest in junior golf is the fact the NGA holds a junior golf school at Harmon. The association will be holding its third annual golf school July 24-29 and the school will be preceded by the provincial junior championships July 21-23 also at Harmon.

"The NGA's main concern now is for the furthering of facilities, without which further expansion of golf activities in the province will be severely curtailed," stated NGA secretary Dr. Duncan Rice.

He said the NGA would like to congratulate the St. John's municipal council for their farsightedness in considering construction of a golf course within the capital city.

"I would also like to take this opportunity to thank the various news media for the excellent coverage they have provided us throughout the past year," added Dr. Rice.

Playoff today to decide Amateur golf championship

The 1971 winner of the Newfoundland Amateur golf championship won't be known until later today when Bill Morrissey of the Blomidon Club in Corner Brook and Peter Stirling of the Grand Falls Golf Club complete their 18-hole playoff at the Bally Haly Golf Club in St. John's.

The playoff was necessary when Morrissey, June Invitational champ, sank a 12-foot putt for a birdie in the 18th hole Monday while minutes later Stirling had his attempted 15-foot birdie putt just roll wide of the cup. He tapped in the ball for a par five to tie Morrissey for first place.

Morrissey carded a fine one over par 71 in Monday's third round of the 54-hole three-day tourney to finish with a 221 total after posting a 76 Saturday and a 74 Sunday. Stirling opened with a 74 Saturday, dropped back one stroke Sunday and his 72 Monday gave him an identical 221 total for the three rounds.

"I knew that Pete had a one stroke lead on me and that I had to make that putt for a birdie. I just aimed for the back of the cup and in it went," stated a very happy Morrissey after completing the final hole. "By making the putt I knew Pete would have to get a birdie on the final hole to win and that I still had a chance."

After two days of almost perfect golf weather Saturday and Sunday, Monday was a complete reverse with heavy rain falling most of the day. Morrissey said the weather bothered him and other golfers as it made their clubs very slippery, calling for a much tighter grip.

"The weather conditions made me concentrate a lot more but I was quite satisfied with my play," said Morrissey. "I missed a lot of putts on the front nine and had a 37 but they began to fall for me on the back nine and as a result I had a 34."

Stirling said the weather didn't bother him much except, as in the case of Morrissey, making the grip on the clubs tighter and swinging easier. He was very pleased with his round of golf saying, "this has got to be the best round of competitive golf I've ever played."

Raynor Lamb of Bally Haly played constant golf over the three days and he fired a 78 Monday to finish third in the tourney with a 228 total, seven strokes behind the co-leaders. Lamb had identical 75's for the first two

rounds and he finished one stroke ahead of defending champ and second round leader Cyril Furlong, also of the host club.

Furlong started the tourney with a two-under par 68 Saturday and slipped back to a 78 Sunday but he still held a three stroke lead over Stirling and Roy Bungay of Harmon. Monday, however, he found the going even tougher and had to settle for an 83 and a 229 three-round total.

"I started out today trying to play steady golf until the weather cleared up but it didn't and that's what killed me," said a rather unhappy Furlong. "My biggest problem was the cold. I was so cold and shaking so much that at times I was afraid I was going to hit the ball while I was addressing it. I just can't play in this type of weather."

Furlong said while he didn't like the weather he wasn't playing too badly up until the 13-hole and only trailed Stirling by one stroke but he took two seven's back to back on 13 and 14 and "after that I knew I didn't have a chance to win."

Veteran Doug Brown of Bally Haly who Sunday won the seniors' title, carded a fine 78 Monday to finish fifth in the amateur with a 230 total. He fired identical 78's in the first two rounds. Dick Tallman of Bally Haly took sixth with a 231 score and he was followed by Bungay and Gerry LeDrew of Blomidon with identical 233 totals, Paul Withers of Bally Haly, 234, and clubmate Keith Rose, 235.

Butch Barron of Harmon had some trouble on the front nine shooting a 48 but he blazed over the back nine with a 36 for an 84 to take top honors in the second division (13-25 handicappers). He had scores of 88 and 83 in the first two rounds and was third heading into the final round before starting his drive that carried him to first place.

John Ballard of Bally Haly was runner up with a 257 total. Round scores of 88-84-87 while two Corner Brook golfers, Lew Andrews and Brian Harley took third and fourth respectively. Andrews shot an 85 Monday and finished with a 260 score while Harley was two strokes back after carding an 85 in the final round.

Second round leader Fred Stagg of Harmon dropped to fifth as he jumped to 95 in the final round for a 263 total after posting 81 and 87 scores for the first two rounds.

Charlie Hutton of Bally Haly walked

off with third division honors. He was the leader right from the opening on a 93, had a 96 in the second round and fired an identical score in the final round Monday to finish with a 285 total and a nine-stroke lead over runner-up Ken Oakley, also of the host club. Oakley also fired a 96 Monday but his previous 101-97 scores had him finish with a 294 total. Wally Long of Bally Haly tied for third with clubmate Gordon Burton, both having identical 303 totals while Ben Alexander of Harmon placed fifth with a 305 total.

Morrissey, Stirling and Gerry LeDrew have clinched three of the four berths on Newfoundland's Willingdon Cup team while an 18-hole playoff is underway today to decide the final spot as well as the second alternate for the team.

The winner of the amateur automatically receives a berth on the Willingdon Cup team while the other three team members come from the best combined scores in the Amateur and June Invitational.

Regardless of who wins the amateur Morrissey and Stirling have definitely clinched berths on the team as has Gerry LeDrew. However, Lamb and John LeDrew of Blomidon have to play off for the fourth position on the team while Furlong and Tallman will clash to decide the second alternate spot.

There was never any doubt that Morrissey would make the team as he finished with a six round total of 441, 22 strokes ahead of Stirling. Gerry LeDrew was two strokes back in third while Brown finished fourth with a 368 total but since he is unable to make the trip to the national championships Lamb and John LeDrew, who tied for fifth with identical 470 totals, have to playoff to decide who takes the fourth spot on the team and who becomes the first alternate.

Young Dave Oxford of Blomidon qualified for the second alternate position by finishing with a 479 total but he is also unable to make the trip so the sixth place finishers, Furlong and Tallman, have to play-off.

They finished with 480 scores.

The amateur officially concluded Monday night with a dance and presentation of prizes but the championship trophy won't be presented until today's playoff is over.

The playoff to decide the amateur title as well as the Willingdon Cup team got underway 11 o'clock this morning.

Stirling captures 18-hole playoff

Twenty-year-old Peter Stirling of the Grand Falls Golf Club is the 1971 Newfoundland Amateur champion.

Stirling captured the province's top golfing award by defeating Bill Morrissey of the Blomidon Club in Corner Brook in an 18-hole playoff Tuesday afternoon at the Bally Haly Golf Club in St. John's.

In capturing his first amateur title Stirling fired a four-over-par 74 to beat Morrissey by three strokes. The playoff was necessary when Stirling and Morrissey tied with identical 221 scores Monday after the final round of the 54-hole tourney. Stirling had rounds of 74 - 75 - 72 while Morrissey, June Invitational champ, opened with a 76 Saturday, followed with a 74 Sunday and finished with a fine one over par 71 Monday in the final round which was played under adverse weather conditions.

Morrissey started the 18-hole playoff on the wrong foot when his first drive off the number one tee went out of bounds in the woods and this was a big break for Stirling.

"When Bill hit his first ball over the fence out of bounds that took the pressure off right away," stated a very happy Stirling following his title victory. "I picked up two strokes after the first hole because of that and it meant Bill had to catch up."

Stirling who lives in Gander but plays out of the Grand Falls club, said he took a birdie on number three hole for a three stroke lead, dropped one stroke on the fourth hole to Morrissey

but got it back on the sixth. "I then picked up two more strokes on him to go five-up after nine but he cut two strokes off over the next four holes," said Stirling.

"However, I birdied 14 to go four up again and with only four holes left to play I figured I just about had it wrapped up."

Peter shot a 38 on the front nine and carded a 36 on the back nine while Morrissey was 43 on the front nine but played much better as the game progressed and shot a 34 on the back nine.

Stirling was overjoyed in winning the title but he wasn't too pleased with his play. He said he hit the ball better during the regulation three rounds of the tourney but today was his worst day although winning the title. "I had to scramble a lot today to make up for bad shots and it was only my shot game (putting and pitching) that saved me," he explained.

"Peter played exceptional golf today," said Morrissey in praising the play of Stirling while at the same time he was expressing disappointment at his own play. "He just killed me on the greens today or I killed myself."

"I was putting badly and I was also missing my chip shots but even when I did make a good putt like on the 11th Peter always made an even better shot to beat me," he added.

Commenting on the 11th hole Morrissey said he made a beautiful 40-foot putt and figured to gain a stroke or two on Stirling since initial tee shot went in the ruff "but Pete came back with two good shots and then made a fine putt to par the hole and keep me from chopping a stroke off his lead."

"Peter played very steady golf and I congratulate him on his fine play in winning the title."

Stirling and Morrissey weren't the only golfers involved in a playoff Tuesday as Raynor Lamb of Bally Hall and John LeDrew of Blomidon played off to decide the fourth and final position on the Newfoundland Willingdon Cup team.

Lamb finished the 18-hole playoff with a 77, one stroke ahead of LeDrew who now becomes the first alternate on the team. Stirling, Morrissey, Gerry LeDrew of Blomidon and Lamb will now represent the province at the Willingdon Cup championship Aug. 10 - 11 in Halifax, N.S.

Stirling automatically received a berth on the team by winning the amateur while Morrissey, LeDrew and Lamb qualified as a result of their combined scores in the Amateur and June Invitational.

Doug Browne, who Sunday won the seniors' title, qualified for the fourth team position but since he was unable to make the trip to the national championships Lamb and LeDrew, who tied for fifth, had to playoff with the loser becoming the first alternate for the team.

This will be Stirling's, Morrissey's and Lamb's second time representing the province in Willingdon Cup play while it will be LeDrew's first time in national competition.

Pro golfer Terry Burns of Truro, N.S. and amateur golfer Charlie Brace of the Ashburn club in Halifax, N.S. started the third annual Newfoundland Open golf tournament on the right foot Thursday as they tied for first place in the one-day Pro-Am segment of the tournament.

Burns and his amateur partners — Ben Karrell, Bruce Martin and Frank Graham, finished with a combined score of 53, 13 under par for the course, as did Brace and his team of Fintan Costello, Harold Goodridge and Bren Devine.

The Pro-Am is an 18-hole affair in which a professional player or a low handicap amateur in some cases, is assigned three amateurs as partners to form a team. The best score recorded by either player on each hole is tallied up to establish an 18-hole score and this is used to determine their final position in the field.

Burns shot an individual score of 75 for the course,

five over par, and received \$300 of the \$1,000 at stake in the Pro-Am. His partners received gifts as did Brace and his team since amateurs are not permitted to accept cash awards.

Newfoundland amateur champ Peter Stirling of Grand Falls and his team of George Lloyd, Paul Doucet, and Ted Hunter finished third with a team score of 57, one stroke ahead of Roger Walker of Moncton, N.B. who took the second place cash prize of \$175. Walker and his partners — Wayne Webby, Art Blair and Brian Stapleton finished with a 58 total.

The top nine pros in the Pro-Am received a share of the \$1,000 and two of them tied for third and received \$137.50 each while five tied for fifth and split the remaining \$350 receiving \$70 apiece.

Butch O'Hearn of the Brightwood club in Dartmouth, N.S. was one of the two pros tied for third even though he fired the se-

cond best individual score of the day, an even par 70. His partners were Fred Brenner, John Mihichuk and Waliv Long. Tied for third with O'Hearn was Ken McBride of Chester, N.S. and his team of Manny McIntyre, Harold Goodridge and Bren Devine.

The pros tied for fifth with teams scores of 60 were George Robinson of the Oakfield club, Halifax, N.S.; John Irwin, Sydney, N.S.; Alan Robinson, Bally Haly; Kelly Burnett, Ashburn club Halifax; and Cec Dowling of the Belvedere club in Charlottetown, P.E.I.

Dave Clayton of Toronto turned in the best score of the day, a two-under par 68, however, the playing pro at the Donalda Golf Club didn't finish in the money as he and his amateur partners finished well down in the final team scores.

O'Hearn had the second best score, a 70, while Gus Murphy of the Galway Country Club, Galway, Ireland and Bus Ogden of Dartmouth tied for third with identical 72s.

Five golfers — Jay Dolan of Leicester, Mass.; McBride, Herb Marcussen of Miami, Fla.; Burnett and Fin Sorensen of Edmonton, Alta. — tied with scores of 74 while one stroke back were George Arnold of Trois Rivières, Que.; Burns, Irwin and Lorne Jennex of North Sydney, N.S.

Not all the pros in the Pro-Am turned in their individual scores since the best score recorded by either of their partners was the one used to establish the team's 18-hole score.

Of the approximately 110 amateurs competing in the Pro-Am, Kees Kuibers carded the best individual score, a three-over par 73. Gerry Anstey of Bally Haly was two strokes back in second while defending low medalist in the Open, Bill Morrissey of the Blomidon Club in Corner Brook, and Cyril Furlong of Bally Haly tied for third with identical 76s. Brace, Fred Kiddy, Butch Barron of Harmon and A.J. Kennedy of Bally Haly tied for fifth with scores of 78, one stroke ahead

of Jim Stirling of Grand Falls.

For many of the golfers at the journey the Pro-Am was just a warm-up for the first round (18-holes) of the 54-hole Newfoundland Open which opened this morning with 28 pros and 100 amateurs taking to the field.

This is the part of the tournament the pros are looking forward to because the first place finisher receives \$1,000 of the \$5,500 purse. And additional money up for grabs is a purse of \$1,000 available for Atlantic Provinces pros only. The top Atlantic Provinces player will receive \$300 of the purse plus his winnings in the \$5,500 Open.

An added incentive is a 1971 sports car donated by Tom Woodford Motors for the first hole-in-one on the par three 178 yard number 13 hole. The prize was unclaimed the last two years.

The first threesome in the first round of the Open teed off at 7:30 this morning and the final threesome was scheduled for 2:30 p.m.

Wins Newfoundland Open title

Third time proves lucky for Jay Dolan

After playing the role of bridesmaid for the last two years Jay Dolan finally stepped into the winner's circle by capturing top honors in the third annual Newfoundland Open golf tournament which concluded Sunday at Bally Haly.

Dolan, playing out of Leicester, Mass., finished the 54-hole tournament with a three-over par 213 to take the title and the \$1,000 first place prize money. He had a disappointing first round Friday firing a 77 but came back with a record 63, seven under par, Saturday to jump into the lead and he stayed out front in the final round Sunday by carding a 73.

The 30-year-old Dolan was runner-up to Bill Miznick of Cape Cod, Mass., in the first Newfoundland Open in 1969 and last year lost out to Bill Wakeham of Victoria, B.C. in a sudden-death playoff. This year, however, he wasn't to be denied and in taking the title

he not only won top money of the \$5,500 up for grabs but he also received a replica of the championship Open Trophy and a blazer with a crest indicating he is the Newfoundland Open champ for 1971.

Herb Holzscheiter of the Thunderbird Club in Ashburn, Ont. and John Morgan of New Sonynar Beach, Fla. tied for the runner-up position, with identical 214 scores, one stroke behind Holzscheiter, who finished ninth in 1969 and seventh in 1970, had individual rounds of 79-71-73 while Morgan, competing in his first Open, came in with scores of 73-69-72 for his 214 total.

They still second and third place prize money and walked off with \$600 apiece.

Jim Morton of Daytona Beach, Fla. finished fourth with a 219 three round total which earned him \$400. He had rounds of 74-74-71.

First round lead John Irwin of Sydney, N.S. was unable to keep up the pace and finished

in a tie for fifth with Dave Clayton of Toronto on a 220 score. Irwin shot a two under par 68 Friday, jumped to a 73 Saturday and Sunday finished with a disastrous 79 to tie Clayton who had rounds of 77-73-72. They collected \$275 each from the Open purse while Irwin added another \$300 to his total winnings for being 1/2 the top Atlantic Provinces pro in the tournament. One thousand dollars was set aside this year for Atlantic Provinces pros only and as a result Irwin ended up winning \$475.

After starting off with a high 81, Butch O'Hearn of Dartmouth, N.S., one of the pre-tourney favorites, settled down in the final two rounds and carded scores of 79-72 to finish seventh with a 223 total. He collected \$300 of the Open purse and another \$175 from the Atlantic Provinces pros purse.

Fin Sorensen of Edmonton, Alta., who finished third last year, and Alan Robinson,

assistant pro at Bally Haly, finished with identical 224 scores and tied for eighth. Sorensen had rounds of 73-73-79 and won \$175 while Robinson shot rounds of 76-74-74 to take \$325 in prize money, \$175 from the Open and \$150 for being the Atlantic Provinces pro.

Lorne Jennex of North Sydney, N.S. rounded out the top 10 with a 226 total and collected \$275.

Each of the 28 pros entered in the tournament received cash prizes with the top nine Atlantic Provinces pros collecting a share of the \$1,000 set aside for them.

Bill Morrissey of the Blomidon club in Corner Brook showed he was the top amateur in the tournament as he finished low medalist in the Open for the second straight year.

The 27-year-old Morrissey, who played out of Bally Haly before being transferred to Corner Brook earlier this year, opened with

a 73 in the first round Friday, slipped slightly to a 74 Saturday and then came through with a fine two under par 68 Sunday to clinch the amateur title.

Charlie Brace of Sydney, N.S. was the first round leader with a one under par 69 but he dropped to a 74 in the second round and found the going even tougher in the final round as he fired a 78 and finished six strokes back of Morrissey with a 221 total.

Kees Kuibers of New Brunswick placed third with a 225 total. He had rounds of 74-78-73 and finished 12 strokes ahead of fourth place finisher Doug Brewer of Fredericton, N.B. Brewer opened with a 76 and slipped to 82 in the second round before carding a 77 in the final round.

Dick Tallman of Bally Haly was runner-up to Morrissey last year but this year he had to settle for a fifth place finish with a 238 total on rounds of 81-79-78. Paul

Withers, also of Bally Haly and one of the top junior golfers in the province, tied with clubmate Cy Furlong for sixth place honors. Withers shot rounds of 80-79-81 while Furlong started off well on rounds of 78-77 but ran into trouble in the final round and had to settle for an 85.

Jim Chalker and Ray Lamb, both of Bally Haly, finished eighth and ninth respectively. Chalker had rounds of 76-81-85 and finished with a 242 score while Lamb shot rounds of 81-82-80 for a 243 total.

As a result of winning the amateur section of the Open, Morrissey received a medal and \$100 in merchandise prizes. A total of nine gross and 15 handicap prizes were presented to the amateurs.

The Newfoundland Open concluded Sunday night at Bally Haly with a presentation of prizes followed by a Newfoundland Soiree which was thoroughly enjoyed by the visiting golfers.

Morrissey wins June Invitational

Bill Morrissey of Bally Haly is regarded as one of the top golfers in the province and he displayed some of the form that earned him this reputation during the annual June Invitational golf tournament at Bally Haly over the weekend.

The 31-year-old veteran golfer captured his fourth June Invitational title as he finished the 54-hole tournament with a 225 score and an eight-stroke victory over runner-up Bill Hryniw of the Halliday Farms Public Golf Course who played the Bally Haly course for the first time over the weekend.

In addition to taking first division honors Morrissey, now leads in the battle for the four berths on the provincial Willingdon Cup team. The three rounds played over the weekend plus the three rounds of the July Invitational in Stephenville next month will be used to select the top four golfers for the team.

Morrissey, who has already played on five provincial Willingdon Cup teams, carded a 73 in Saturday's opening round, followed with a 74 Sunday before slipping back to a 78 in Monday's final round.

"My score was a little higher today," stated Morrissey after winning the title, "but that's maybe because I was taking it a little easy since I had a comfortable lead and there was no real pressure on me."

"With an eight or nine shot lead it's pretty difficult to blow it," he added.

When asked if the course or weather conditions affected his play the veteran golfer said he found the course in the best shape it's ever been in while the only time the weather bothered him any was on Saturday when it was a little cold.

Morrissey is now looking forward to the July Invitational and possibly his second major

victory of the 1976 season but the main thing isn't necessarily winning. "I always try to win but the main thing is to make a berth on the Willingdon Cup team so I'll just try to play consistent golf and take it a round at a time."

"It's a real dog fight for the four positions on the team and there are a couple of golfers from Stephenville who are still in contention for a berth on the team and they'll be tough on their own course," he explained.

Hryniw got off to a disappointing start Saturday as with only Friday's practice round under his belt he turned in an 84 score. But Sunday he bounced back with a 75 and yesterday turned in a fine 74 for his 233 total.

"That first round really hurt me," said Hryniw, "but after that I played pretty well and I'm pleased with finishing second."

Veteran Roy Bungay of

Stephenville came in third with rounds of 78-80-77 for a 235 total, two strokes back of Hryniw and 10 behind the champion. Tony Manning of Bally Haly was fourth with a 237 score for the 54-holes on individual rounds of 78-78-81 while Gerry Boland of Stephenville was one stroke back in fifth. He carded rounds of 78-81-79.

Second division honors went to Lloyd George of Bally Haly as he posted a three-round total of 232 to finish five strokes ahead of clubmate Jim Hiscock. George had rounds of 79-83-86 while Hiscock posted scores of 84-80-79. Third was Bob Dawe of Grand Falls who carded score of 80-90-85 for a 257 total and a one-stroke edge over Bruce Martin of Bally Haly who had rounds of 8-83-87. Reg Dean, also of the host club, was fifth with a 263 total on rounds of 82-91-90.

Larry Gushue of Bally Haly took top honors in third division by only by a single stroke over clubmate Ed Dawe. Gushue had scores of 102-100-107 for a 303 total while Dawe turned in rounds of 105-96-103 and 304 score. Jim O'Brien and Gerry Bennett, both of Halliday Farms, finished third and fourth respectively. O'Brien carded scores of 112-100-99 for a 311 total while Bennett posted a 314 score on rounds of 106-108-96. D.M. Burke of Bally Haly was fifth with a 317 total from rounds of 102-107-108.

Alex Powell of Corner Brook, president of the Newfoundland Golf Association, was on hand to present the various trophies and prizes to the top golfers in the three divisions.

For the first time a Newfoundland-born golfer has been named to the top ten by the Canadian Ladies Golf Association. Rebecca Stark, a former member of Blomidon Club, Corner Brook and now a resident of Halifax, was named sixth among the ladies top golfers. She won the Provincial Ladies (Junior) Championship in 1975 and was runner-up in 1974.

June 27

Bally Haly golfer Win McNamara keeps getting better with age

When Win McNamara leads the provincial senior ladies' golf team to Winnipeg for the Canadian championships Aug. 27-31, it will mark at least the 15th year that she has represented Newfoundland in national golf competition.

Win recently won the provincial senior ladies' title in Stephenville for the fifth consecutive year and this time she is the only St. John's golfer to qualify for the four-member team. The other three are all from Grand Falls, Vi Pike, Edith Dean and Flo Bond. The alternate in case one of the first four can't make the trip to Winnipeg is Mary Heaney of Bally Haly.

Mrs. McNamara has played all of her lengthy career at Bally Haly and in addition to being provincial senior ladies' champ for the past five years, she qualified for the provincial amateur team in national competition "at least nine or 10

times.

"I can't remember exactly, but I think I've represented Newfoundland every year for the past 15 years in golf," said Mrs. McNamara. "I started golfing about 30 years ago and it seems I got better with age. I broke 80 (with a 79) just two weeks ago for the first time in my career."

Hryniw provincial amateur champ

Bill Hryniw is a name that's becoming more and more prominent on the provincial golfing scene and it's easy to see why.

The 29-year-old native of Windsor, Ont., has been living in the province for four years and it has only been the last two years that he's gotten back to his golf game. However, in that time he's finished runner-up in three major provincial tournaments and this past weekend he made it to the winner's circle

by capturing the Newfoundland Amateur championship.

A record field of 174 golfers competed in the three-day, 54-hole event at Bally Haly in St. John's and Hryniw, a member of the host club, beat out defending champ and club-mate Billy Morrissey for the title.

The provincial seniors' tournament was also held in conjunction with the amateur and it came as no real surprise when Doug Brown of Bally Haly won the title for the fourth time in the last six years. He out-classed a dozen other golfers (50 years of age and over) to take

top honors.

Hryniw, who has been playing golf for 20 years, trailed Morrissey after the first and second rounds but capitalized on a poor final round by the defending champ Monday to take the title. Hryniw, a member of the Newfoundland Willingdon Cup team the last two years, finished with a 54-hole score of 225 on rounds of 77-73-75 and he finished three strokes ahead of Morrissey who had rounds of 75 and 74 before soaring to a 79 yesterday.

Morrissey held a one-stroke edge starting the final round but got into trouble on the par four first hole and had to take an eight which put him three strokes behind Hryniw.

"Billy had a bad first hole but he started to come back after that and closed to within one stroke," stated Hryniw. "However, after catching up he took a seven on the par five 12th hole to once again drop three behind and that was it."

Hryniw, runner-up in the July Invitational earlier this season and second in last year's June and July Invitationals, said he was pleased with his play in the tournament. "I guess the key for me was the fact I played steady golf for the three days. I made a couple of clutch putts when I had to and this was what kept me ahead of times."

"While I was making some good putts Billy (Morrissey) was missing a few that most times he would make and it was just a bad day for him in the final round. The course was in excellent shape for the tourney and all in all things turned out well for me and I'm happy."

Bally Haly golfers captured the top positions as Ralph Bowers of the host club took third place with a 233 total, one stroke ahead of club-mate

Lloyd Cooke.

Wayne Oake of Blomidon Golf and Country Club in Corner Brook captured top honors in division two "A" as he carded a 242 score for the 54-holes. Chuck Parisi and Randy Pearcey of Bally Haly tied for second spot with identical 246 scores while first place in division two "B" went to Dr. John Collingwood of Bally Haly with a 268 total. Gerry Bennett of Halliday Farms was the division three winner with a 295 total for the three-day competition.

The low net award (scores minus handicap) for the tournament went to Mike Jackson of the Tamarac Club in Labrador City for his 199 total.

Winning golf titles is nothing new to Doug Brown as he was the provincial amateur champ in 1967 and has also won just about every other club title at Bally Haly. He first won the seniors' title in 1971, repeated as champ in '72, however, he didn't compete the next year because of illness.

Brown returned to the fairways in 1975 and took the seniors' crown again before losing out to Dr. George Grant of Harmon last year.

Brown was consistent in the two-day 36-hole tourney as he posted identical 80 scores for the two rounds and he also carded an 80 Monday in the final round of the amateur tourney. Derek Stevenson of Corner Brook was his nearest rival with a 168 total.

"I was pleased with my play and I was never really pressed in the tourney," stated Brown who has been on three provincial Willingdon Cup teams. "I had a pretty comfortable lead and I just stayed out front."

The tournaments concluded with a presentation of trophies and prizes Monday night at Bally Haly.

Top ranked golfers in ladies' amateur

Seven of Canada's 1978 ranked top ten lady golfers will be playing in the 1979 National Amateur Golf Championship at the Bally Haly Golf and Country Club, August 20 to 25, 1979. And seven of the top ten ranked junior lady golfers from 1978 will also participate in the 1979 classic.

Cathy Sherk, last year's champion will not be defending her title. Mrs. Sherk, winner of many amateur titles including the 1978 United States Amateur, has joined the professional ranks and plays on the L.P.G.A. tour.

Of the 89 entries received so far, 39 of the golfers have a handicap of five or less.

Heading the impressive field of golfers will be Gail Moore of British Columbia with a handicap of plus one. Mrs. Moore, a junior winner in 1959, 1960, and 1961 won the open in 1970.

Another top entry is Marlene Streit, Ontario handicap zero, who has the runner-up in 1978 and includes in her titles U.S. Amateur 1956, British Amateur 1953, and Australian Amateur 1963.

Nova Scotia wins the interprovincial junior ladies team title with 331 total. Newfoundland is eighth with 364 and their scores were Marie Graham 178 (90 + 88), Kathleen Jean 186 (91 + 95) and Ethene Daly 193 (93 + 100).

Excitement is building and interest is peaking at the Bally Haly Golf and Country Club in St. John's in anticipation of the 1979 Canadian women's amateur golf championships which begin today and run all this week.

Many of the top lady amateur golfers in Canada have been arriving in the city since Friday and by Sunday registration had been completed. The athletes have been preparing for this morning's practice round.

It's the first time Newfoundland has played host to the Canadian amateur championships and, needless to say, the host committee has things under control.

"Everything is well in hand," public relations coordinator Elizabeth Archibald told The Daily News Sunday. "We're all geared up and ready for what should prove to be a very interesting competition," Mrs. Archibald stated.

The course itself at Bally Haly has been groomed by Bill Mahon and his crew. "We

handed the course over to the national executive Sunday for

inspection and they were very pleased with it," explained Mrs. Archibald, who is also overseeing the grounds committee. "In fact," she said, "they were pleased with all the arrangements to date".

The host committee, nicknamed the "Yellow Birds" because of their yellow costumes, have been working extremely hard in preparing for the tournament. There are more than 100 volunteers involved in the various committee operations. Win McNamara is tournament chairman. Ruth Carter is secretary and Sonia Ryan is committee chairman. Cynthia Landrigan is provincial ladies golf chairman and she has been working closely with all various committee chairmen.

Today has been set aside for a practice round beginning at 8:00 a.m. "It's a funday as well as Tuesday," says Mrs. Archibald. Functions have been planned for most of the day and there will be a dinner tonight at the Old Colony Club.

Mrs. Archibald pointed out that many of the golfers were visiting the province for the first time and had brought along members of their family as well. The golfers will play in "two-ball foursomes" Tuesday beginning at 8:00 a.m. The evening is free. There will be an executive party at Bally Haly.

The golfers get down to serious business Wednesday and Thursday when the qualifying rounds for the open, amateur and team championships take place. These will decide which

golfers go on to play the last two days in the open for the amateur championship.

Meanwhile, Mrs. Archibald explained that many of the junior ladies who competed in the recent national junior and inter-provincial team championships at Corner Brook will take part in the open competition here.

Rebecca Stark, a former Corner Brook native, who now plays out of Armdale N.S., captured the national junior

women's golf championship with a 54-hole total of 235. Janine Getty of Burnaby, B.C. placed second, three-strokes behind, followed by fourteen-year-old Nancy Ann Callan. Stark's Nova Scotia team won the inter-provincial title.

Some of the outstanding golfers scheduled to compete in the 1979 championships include Ontario's Marlene Steward Streit, who will be seeking an incredible 12th title, Gail Moore of British

Columbia, Betty Cole of Alberta, Gayle Borthwick of Ontario and Michele Guibault of Quebec.

Newfoundland is represented by Janet Peters, Elizabeth Murphy, Henge Bruce and Heather Alexander.

Tickets for this week's tournament are \$1.50 per day or spectators can pick up a week-long pass for just \$5.

Brothers worked hard to keep course in shape

"It seems, ever since I was five or six years old, I had a shovel in my hands." Bill Mahon is 31 years old and his entire life has been devoted to the soil, landscaping with his father.

Bill is head groundskeeper at Bally Haly Golf and Country Club. He has three members of his family working along with him as they battle the hot, dry weather in their efforts to keep the St. John's course in good condition and in their efforts to have it in tip-top shape for the Canadian ladies' amateur championship, which began Monday.

Bill Mahon has been at Bally Haly for the past four and a half years and says, "This is the hardest summer I've ever seen. It's so hot and dry, the fairways are just burnt up, and it takes all our time to keep the greens from drying out."

"Not only that, but we keep getting breaks in the watering system almost every day and it's a constant struggle to keep ahead of the drying out process."

Bill's brother Richie chimes in, "and the tees are a bigger problem. To keep from losing them altogether, we have to pull water to them in a 200-gallon tank. It takes half an hour to load the tank, another half hour to spray it out, not to mention the travel time. Each tee needs 1,000 gallons so it takes five trips to do one tee and it takes over an hour each trip. So it's almost a day's work to do just one tee and there are 18 of them. 'Tis enough to drive you mad, and not a drop of rain in over two months."

Bill nods his head in agreement.

Richie is a year younger than Bill. He's rather outspoken compared to his brother, who says only what needs to be said and in as few words as possible. But the two get along extremely well together. They are members of a very large family.

Richard and Joan Mahon had 18 children, the biggest family in the Logy Bay area. Richard, or Dick as he is familiarly known, was a landscaper of reknown and was involved in laying sod in just about every major project in St. John's. The boys worked along with him and absorbed a great knowledge of how to get things to grow.

Now they are almost blasé about the whole team. After the hard work, they put in with their father, cutting sods by hand from daylight to dark, a regular days work at Bally Haly is almost a holiday.

Bill reminisces, "Ya know, we lived just about where the Marine Lab is now, and we

walked to school every day. That was about seven miles over to St. Francis of Assisi School in Outer Cove. When we got home in the afternoon, we would go to work with the skipper until dark, and we thought nothing of it. That was all we knew. That was life."

"And with the big family we had, no one got any special attention. We didn't think we were working hard, but looking back now, I think mother worked the hardest of all."

"Ya know, she baked bread twice a day just about every day, and some days three times."

In pops Richie with a comment. "Now the family is scattered all over Canada from here to Vancouver, and do ya know, she used to send us our Christmas stockings no matter where we were. That's right, she'd hang up our stockings just the same as if we were home and send them to us. She was a wonderful woman, always in good humour, even though she was faced with an incredible workload and always with small children around."

Again, Bill nods agreement.

"Now, says he, 'there are only seven at home so there's hardly anything for her to do.' He chuckles. "She's out working now...at the Janeway." His eyes twinkle as he adds, "that's easy to understand, because

she always had to be around children."

Richie laughs out loud as he says, "Yeah, not much to do at home. All she does now is spend the evening getting tomorrow's dinner ready and cooking that. Then she's out of bed at 6 o'clock to get her wash done and clean up the house. She gets all the housework done before she goes to work at 9 o'clock. Amazing."

The brothers' voices are warm, almost wistful, when they speak of their mother. There's a great depth of feeling.

There's love.

Bill is not one for emotion. So he switches the subject. "I'm a bit tormented about this championship. We've got all we can do right now to keep the course in reasonable shape."

He pauses, then says emphatically, "We have things right. C'mon Rich, get that tank filled and get water on number three tee."

The Mahons of Logy Bay—becoming a tradition at Bally Haly.

Bill's father and his grandfather also worked at the club. His grandfather as a matter of fact, was involved in laying in the first greens and the boys continue the long-standing association. They are aware of it, proud of it, and their work is more than a job, it's a vacation.

Marlene has mellowed but still loves golf

Marlene Streit is the same, but in the same breath, a different person. She's the same lady from Fonthill, Ont., who everybody at the Bally Haly Golf and Curling Club have been keeping their eyes on since the 45-year-old mother of two and approximately 90 other ladies began play in the 1979 Canadian women's amateur golf championship Wednesday at Bally Haly.

But she's not the same little girl, who at the age of about 15 or 16 opened a conversation with "do you play golf" and then if the response was negative, walked away and wondered why anyone could possibly say no to such an inquiry.

Like a fine cup of coffee, Mrs. Douglas Streit is mellowing a bit. She's not interested in material things as much as she once possibly was, but rather with the association one of her calibre makes by meeting people and enjoying company. Granted, she's still competitive, as her opening round 76 Wednesday will attest to, but competitiveness is no longer the most important thing in her life.

Marlene, like most successful golfers, began loving the sport at a very early age, 12 to be exact, when she took up caddying at the Lookout Point Golf and Country Club in her hometown, Fonthill.

From there, it was chipping here and putting there, until she entered her first competitive tournament at the age of 16, the Ontario Amateur. She qualified but was eliminated in the opening round.

"It hurt, but I knew this was the thing I wanted to pursue," Streit said Wednesday. "I wanted to keep playing."

And keep playing she did.

She won the British Amateur tournament in 1953, the U.S. Amateur in 1956 and the Australian Amateur in 1963, not to mention the numerous club and provincial tournaments, which material-wise have provided her house with pounds on pounds of silverware. She finished runner-up in the Canadian Amateur last year to Cathy Sherk, now a professional. She has golfed in Australia, Spain, Mexico, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, England, Argentina, United States and of course, Canada.

DIDN'T TURN PRO

But what about this idea of turning professional?

"To tell you the truth, I've never given much thought to turning pro," she says. "I

wanted to graduate from college and simply play golf, it didn't really matter where. And I did play a lot, so I've never regretted my decision about becoming a pro."

Streit enjoys the Bally Haly course. She finds it a definite challenge.

"It's a nice course, although there seems to be a lot of walking between the tees and greens," she said.

"And it's a challenge because of the number of blind shots and blind holes."

"But everyone is in the same boat, so like me, they'll just have to adapt. I like it."

SECOND PLACE TIE

With her 18-hole total of 76 Wednesday, Marlene found herself in a second-place tie with Stacey West, also of Ontario. The leader, with an opening round of 73, is Denise Lavigne of Quebec. Three golfers are four strokes back

at 77.

"This is a very strong Canadian field and I'm sure it will go right to the finish Saturday," said Streit, who is a member of both the Golf and Sports Hall of Fame. "There's a lot of good young golfers here, most of them gaining their experience by playing through college."

Which brings her to what should be prescribed to anyone, regardless of what sex, when it comes to wanting to take up golf and take it up seriously.

"I don't care how gifted one is, they have to practise and keep practising," she said. "You have to give up a lot of your time, but if you work hard, you'll find that you can make it happen."

Streit considers her British and U.S. Amateur wins as her biggest thrills so far.

B.C. leads inter-provincial race

Quebec golfer shoots a record 73

ST. JOHN'S (CP) — Betty Cooke of Coquitlam, B.C., and Marilyn O'Connor of Calgary were one stroke back at 77. British Columbia led in the race for the inter-provincial team title with a total of 235, three better than Alberta. Ontario followed at 242; Quebec, 246; Prince Edward Island, 248; Saskatchewan, 250; Nova Scotia, 252; Manitoba, 260; New Brunswick, 262 and Newfoundland, 292.

Cooke's 77 combined with a 78 shot by Gall Moore, also of Coquitlam, and an 80 fired by Holly Warne of Richmond to lift B.C. into the lead in the twoday provincial competition.

Cole and O'Connor paced Alberta with a pair of 77's with Cheryl French of Camrose adding an 84.

The provincial title will be decided after today's second round. Each province has four players and the best three scores each day make up the final total.

In the individual competition, the field will be cut to 60 after 36 holes and reduced to the top 36 including ties for Saturday's closing round.

FOG BLOWN AWAY

When the golfers teed off early Wednesday morning, the fog that had blanketed the course during Tuesday's practice round had been replaced by numbing wind, despite intermittent sunshine.

And the wind, blasting in off the Atlantic Ocean just a few miles away, played havoc with drives and long iron shots.

"The wind condition was bad," Lavigne said. "We couldn't go for the pin. We had to go pretty much to the side to get on the green."

"I didn't try to hit long and on some holes I played short and chipped onto the green."

The 5,630-yard course has undulating fairways, which produce a number of tough lies,

and several hidden greens requiring precision approach shots at all times.

O'Connor, who was five over par at 77, said the wind seemed to be constantly in her face.

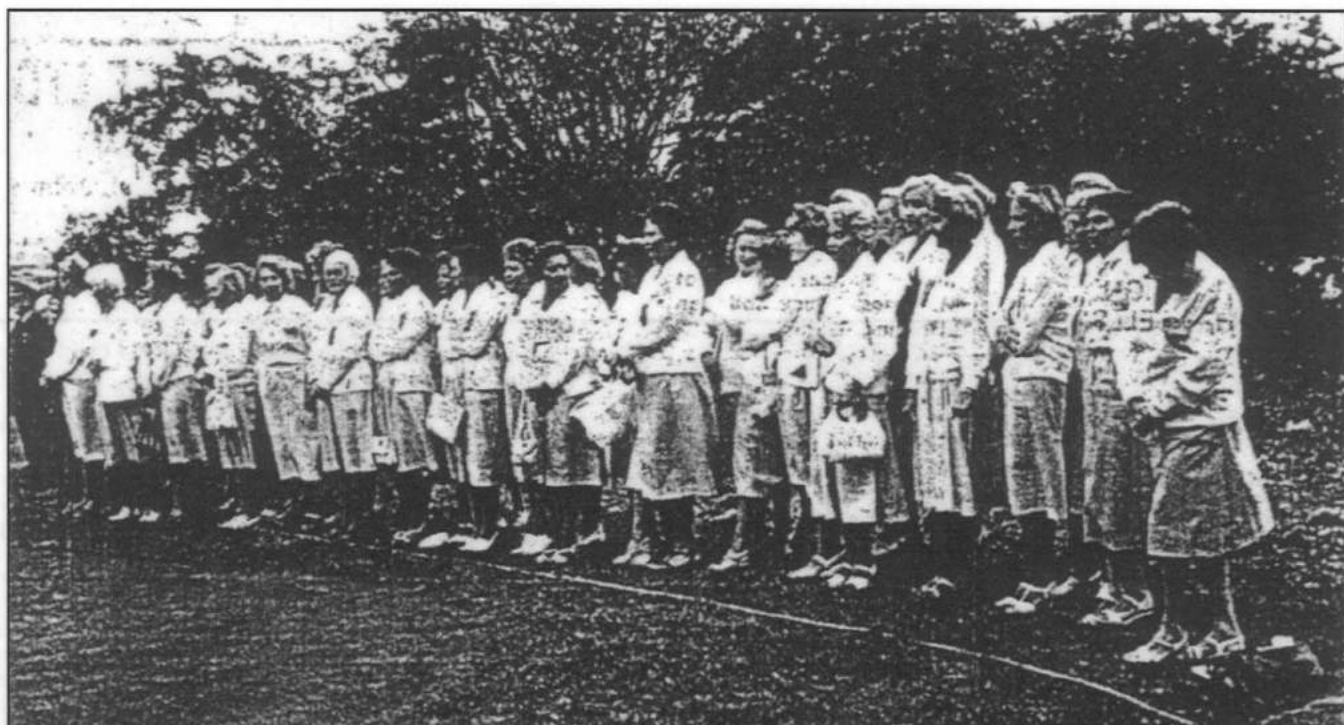
"We had every type of wind and on most holes it was right into us," she said. "On other holes it was a cross-wind that made the tricky golf course even more difficult."

Lavigne had great success with her short game, especially her putter, to record 15 pars, two bogeys and one birdie.

Denise Lavigne of Montreal parlayed a conservative approach on the wind-lashed Bally Haly Golf course into a record 73 and a three-stroke lead after one round in the Canadian women's amateur golf championship Wednesday.

Lavigne broke the old mark of 75 on the course buffeted by winds gusting to 50 miles an hour under partly cloudy skies and bone-chilling temperatures.

Two Ontarians, Stacey West of Thornhill and Marlene Streit of Fonthill, were tied in second

with 76. Lynne Cooke of Coquitlam, Betty Cole of Edmonton and Marilyn O'Connor of Calgary were one stroke back at 77.

British Columbia led the race for the inter-provincial team title with a total of 235, three better than Alberta. Ontario followed at 242; Quebec, 246; Prince Edward Island, 248; Saskatchewan, 250; Nova Scotia, 252; Manitoba, 260; New Brunswick, 262 and Newfoundland, 292.

Cooke's 77 combined with a 78 shot by Gail Moore, also of Coquitlam, and an 80 fired by Holly Warne of Richmond to lift B.C. into the lead in the Tuesday provincial competition.

Cole and O'Connor paced Alberta with a pair of 77's with Cheryl French of Camrose adding an 84.

The provincial title will be decided after today's second round. Each province has four players and the best three scores each day make up the final total.

In the individual competition, the field will be cut to 60 after 36 after 36 holes and reduced to the top 36 including ties for Saturday's closing round.

When the golfers teed off early Wednesday morning, the fog that had blanketed the course during Tuesday's practice round had been replaced by numbing wind, despite intermittent sunshine.

And the wind, blasting in off the Atlantic Ocean just a few miles away, played havoc with drives and long iron shots.

"The wind condition was bad," Lavigne said. "We couldn't go for the pin. We had to go pretty much to the side to get on the green."

"I didn't try to hit long and on some holes I played short and chipped onto the green."

The 5,630-yard course has undulating fairways, which produce a number of tough lies, and several hidden greens requiring precision approach shots at all times.

O'Connor, who was five over par at 77, said the wind seemed to be constantly in her face.

"We had every type of wind and on most holes it was right into us," she said. "On other holes it was a cross-wind that made the tricky golf course even more difficult."

Lavigne had great success with her short game,

especially her putter, to record 15 pars, two bogeys and one birdie.

West, women's junior

champion in 1974, 1976 and 1977, fired four bogeys on the front but recovered to play even par 36 on the final nine holes.

Women's amateur golf championships

Stacey West is new leader after setting course record at 72

Ontario's Stacey West forged into the second-round lead at the 72-hole Canadian women's amateur and provincial golf championships with a record setting 72 on the 5,630-yard Bally Haly golf course.

West, of Thornhill, grabbed a three stroke lead at 148 over first-round leader Denise Lavigne of Montreal, who had shaved two strokes off the old record with an opening day 73.

Lavigne, who soared to a six-over-par 78, said she was feeling some pressure at being in the early lead and that may have shaken her nerves.

But some steady golf by the contingent from British Columbia carried that province to its seventh win in the last 12 years.

Lynn Cooke of Coquitlam led the four-member team with a three-over-par 75, good enough to put her in a third-place tie for individual honors with Cheryl McConnell of Toronto at 152.

Gaile Moore, also of Coquitlam, fired a 78 and

combined with an 80 from Holly Warne of Richmond, to give B.C. a 468 total and a six-stroke win over Ontario.

Only the best three scores counted in the total and all scores count in the final two rounds for the amateur crown. The field will be reduced to 60 and ties from 86 for today's round and further cut to 36 and ties for Saturday's final round.

Ontario's second Carol McGahan and Karin Mundinger fired 78's to go along with McConnell's 74 to lift Ontario into second place, two strokes ahead of Alberta, who ended the day at 476.

Quebec was one stroke back at 477. Manitoba had 479 and Nova Scotia was 485.

The 18-hole course, noted for its rolling fairways and narrow approaches to tight, often

hidden greens, was finally freed from the weatherman's grip which had turned the last two days into a frigid, wet affair.

The fog, chilling temperatures and wind-swept rain that had moved in off the Atlantic just a few kilometres away gave way to warm, sunny skies and moderate winds.

West, who dominated junior golf with three national titles in four years during the mid 70s, said she hit the ball well from tee to green.

"I putted a lot better and chipped a lot better because the wind held down today," she said.

MAD AT PUTTING

Lavigne said she was not only frustrated but mad at the way she played.

"The last two greens made me very mad," she said. "I had a par but was in good position for an eagle on 17 and on 18 I was in birdie position but I three-putted for a bogie. Marlene Streit of Fonthill,

Ont., seeking her 12th win since 1951, ended the day tied with Kathy Powers of Lunenburg, N.S. at 153. Marilyn O'Connor of Calgary and Betty Cole of Edmonton were next at 55 followed by Christa Teno of Toronto and Gail Moore of Coquitlam, both at 156.

Everyone has their eye on the 41-year-old Streit, who seems to be laying back waiting to make a move. Streit won her last title at Charlottetown in 1973 and was last year's runner-up to Fonthill's Cathy Sherk, now professional.

Streit said after the first round that she tries to be aggressive at all times but the juices really begin to flow during the final two days.

But West said Streit has a fight on her hands.

"She's not playing as much as she used to and has a few more things on her mind," said West. "There's just too many people out here."

apparent loss of control.

Lavigne bogeyed four holes in a row on the back nine including a triple bogey on 12.

And neither golfer knew that Angelillo, seven strokes back after nine holes, was slowly chipping away at the lead and moving within striking distance of the leader.

As Angelillo approached the 16th tee she was only two strokes back.

But disaster struck as she hit her drive into the trees to the right. She hit a provisional ball down the centre of the fairway, but chose to look for her ball rather than take a two-stroke penalty.

TRIED TO RECOVER

Angelillo found her first ball

Betty Cole of Edmonton at 310 and Barbara Bunkowsky of Campbellville, Ont., at 311.

West started the day with a five stroke lead over Angelillo, 26, who set a course record 68 during third round play and Lavigne.

After nine holes on the 5,630-yard course West had a comfortable six-stroke margin

hidden deep in the woods, but felt she had a chance to hit the green about 160 yards away through a narrow gap.

She was wrong. Her second shot rifled off a tree and imbedded itself deeper in the woods. It took her one more stroke and a penalty drop to finally hit the fairway, lying just behind a trap at the edge of the green.

She then hit the ball only a couple of feet forward into the trap.

She blasted out and settled for a nine, which eventually cost her second place.

Meanwhile West recovered from her bogey on 16 to fire two magnificent birdies on the last two holes.

Bill Hryniw of St. John's fired a sizzling two-under par 69 Sunday to capture the 1979 Atlantic Amateur Golf Championship at the Bally Haly Golf and Curling Club. Hryniw, from Bally Haly, combined his 69 with a Friday score of 74 and Saturday's 77 to finish with a total of 220, two shots better than the 222 carded by Graham McIntyre of the Ashburn Golf Club in Halifax. McIntyre shot 76 and 73 in his first two rounds. But were it not for some great work on the final three holes Sunday, Hryniw may not have been the winner of the third annual classic. Bill Hryniw of the St. John's Bally Haly club captured the Newfoundland June Invitational championship at the Blomidon golf club in Corner Brook Monday with a three-day low gross total of 218 to finish the course at eight over par.

This is Hryniw's fifth Newfoundland title, but he says that it is the first time ever that he has won the June Invitational.

The winner said that the course was in excellent shape and, "the greens are the best that I've ever seen. They held well and they putted true."

Hryniw feels that as he continued through the three-day event his play got steadily worse. "I hit the ball well the first day but it got gradually worse."

In the three days Hryniw's score dropped from an even par in the first day to five over par in the final day of competition.

In the final day of competition, Hryniw's playing partner, Ron McTavish, gave him a run for the money as he scored a 18-hole total of 72 to

"Ron hit real well in the front nine (third day) to pick up strokes on me," Hryniw said, "but I steadied down in the back nine."

According to the champ, "the turning point was the thirteenth hole when I birdied to pick up three strokes on Ron when he double bogeyed."

McTavish finished with a three-day total of 224 on a combined 78, 74 and 72.

George Chaulk of Stephenville finished third while Dwight Chapman of St. John's finished tied in fourth spot.

Jim Stick, last year's June Invitational winner, finished in fifth place with John LeDrew of the Corner Brook club and Dave Dyer of St. John's.

The June Invitational was the first in the playdowns to see who represents Newfoundland in the the Willingdon Cup, a national amateur tournament.

BEST HOPES

John LeDrew stands one of best chances of making the provincial squad for the Corner Brook club, along with fourth-

place finisher Bob Hicks, also of Blomidon.

LeDrew felt that he should've done better in the three-day event to finish up with a four or five lower score than he did. He said he could have done better on the first day as he double bogeyed late in the round to finish the first day of competition with a 75. "It could've been a 73," LeDrew said.

On the second and third day of competition LeDrew said that it was an uphill battle to get back in the running. He completed the second day with an 82 and managed to fight back on the final day to get a 78 for an overall score of 235.

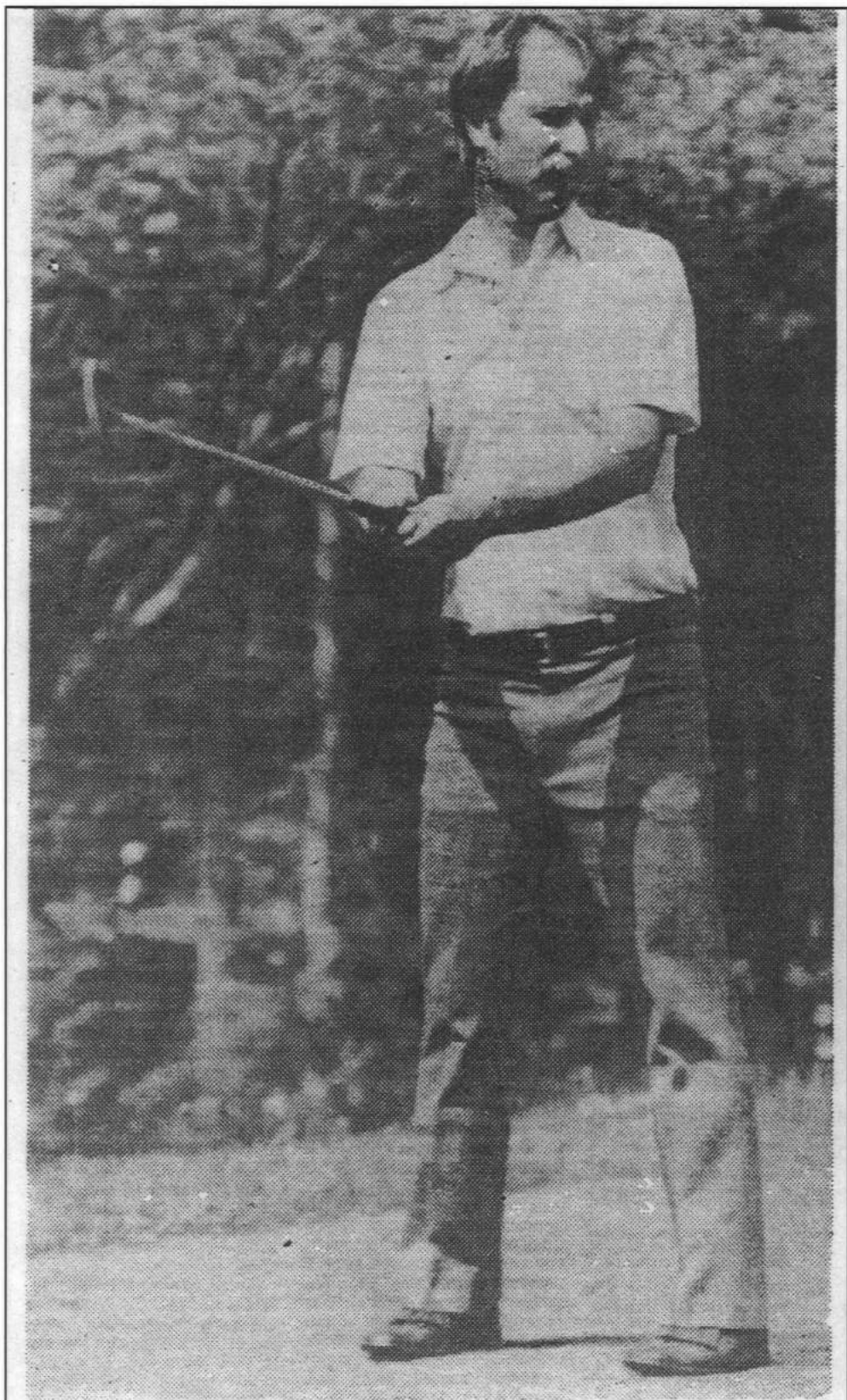
The next leg of provincial qualifying competition will be at Grand Falls this coming weekend and LeDrew expects to fulfil his hopes of making the provincial team.

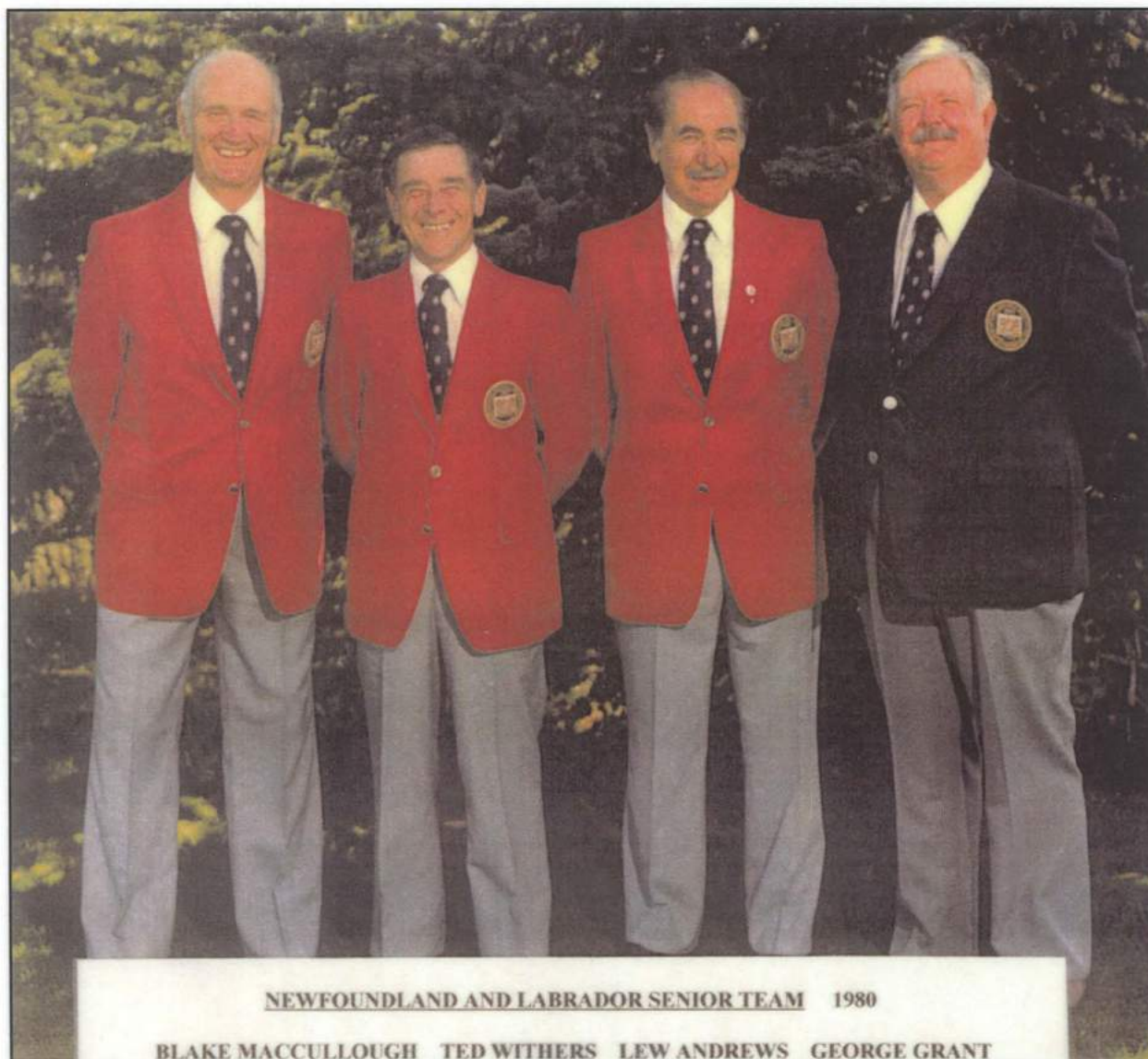

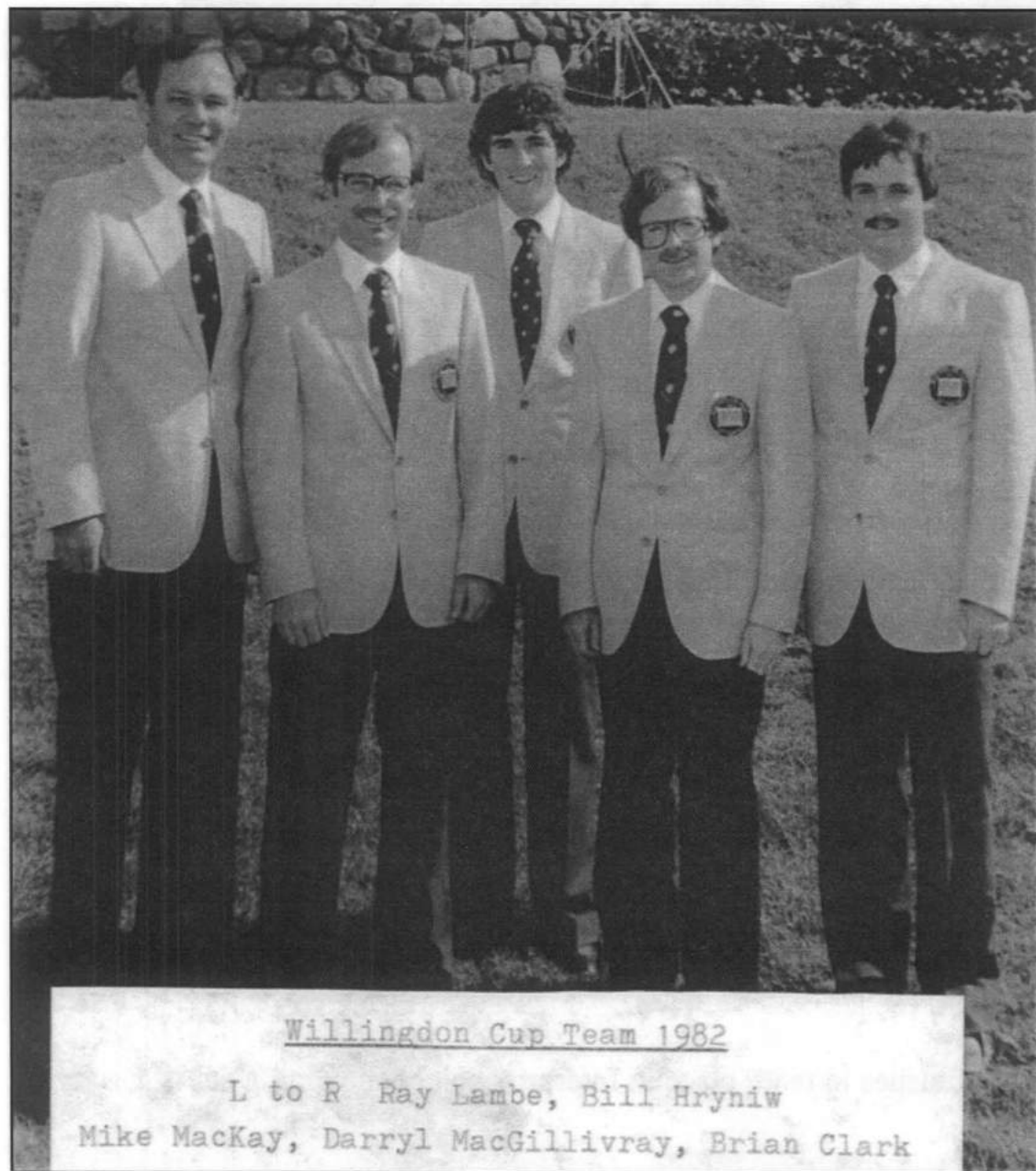

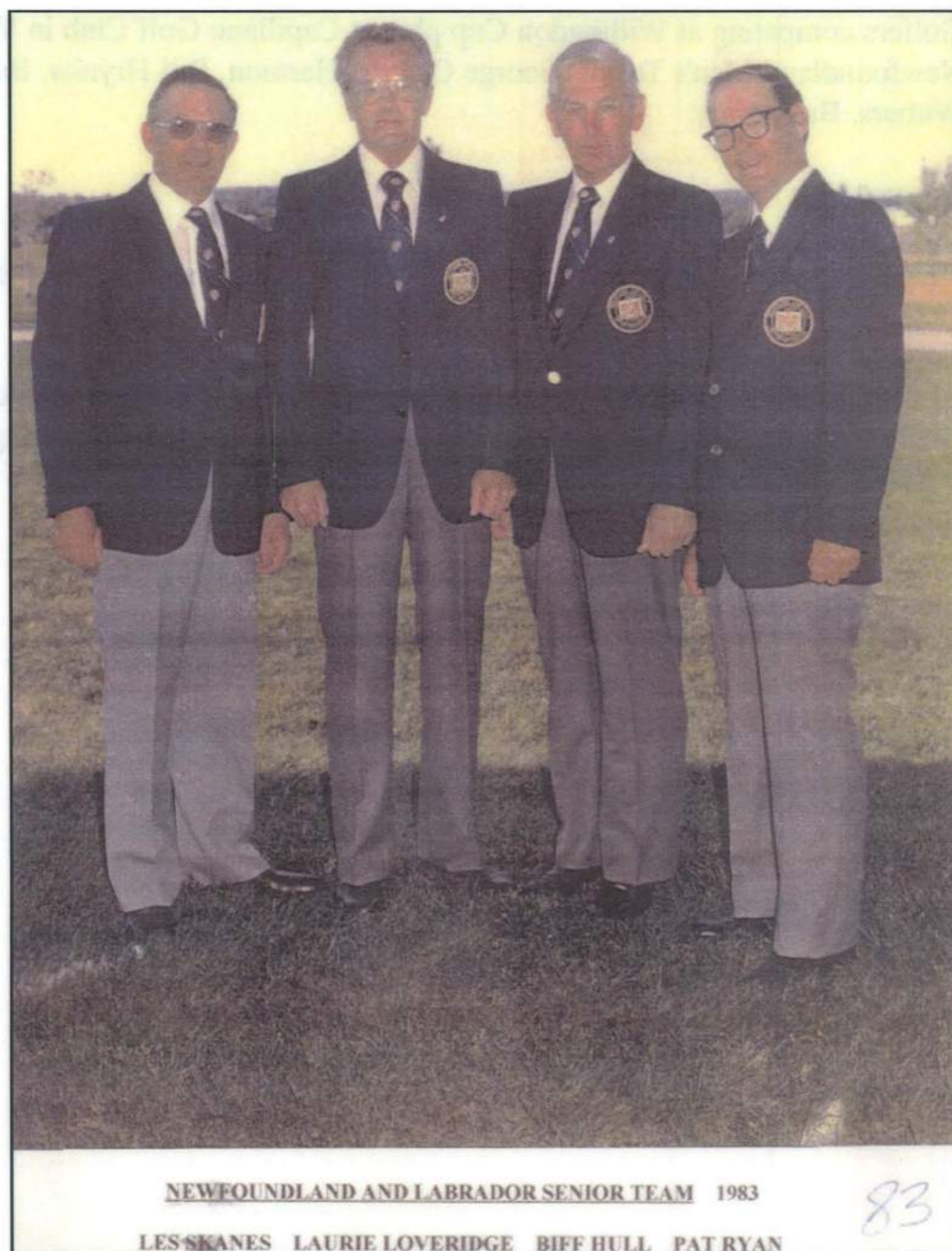

"Backyard" golf course key to golfer's success

The convenience of having a golf course "right in the backyard" of his Windsor, Ont. residence was instrumental in getting Bill Hryniw started in golf.

That start came 30 years ago when Hryniw was eight years old. Today, Hryniw, 38, is one of the top golfers in the province, having represented Newfoundland on 11 occasions in national golf competitions since 1976.

"I have been more successful at golf than the other sports I played," said Hryniw, project manager of DelCan, a local engineering company in St. John's.

"I have enjoyed the sport of golf since taking it up 30 years ago. I took up the sport at an early age

and golf came fairly natural to me but as in any sport, practice is a main ingredient," said Hryniw, who has played in the Metro Basketball League for the past 12 years.

Hryniw, who moved from Ontario to St. John's in 1973 to take up a position of project manager with DelCan, recalled one incident the year after he began his golf career.

"I remember I had a picture taken of me when I was nine years old while playing in a local golf tournament in Windsor and the golf clubs were almost as big as I was. The picture appeared in the local paper and I probably still have the clipping at home," said Hryniw, who said he won a couple of local golf tournaments in Windsor.

Hryniw continued to make a name for himself during his high school days at Vincent Massey High School in Windsor where he was a member of the golf team for three years.

He attended the University of Windsor in 1968 and while working on his engineering degree, perform-

ed with the university golf team.

In 1973, Hryniw moved from Ontario to St. John's to take up a position as project engineer with DelCan and two years later, when the Public Golf Course, located in Pippy Park, was constructed, he decided to return to the sport.

"When I first came here (St. John's) in 1973, I didn't play golf for the first two years because I had lost interest somewhat but when the Public Golf Course opened, it rekindled interest for me in golf. I was able to play and got in my first provincial tournament. I surprised myself by finishing second behind Bill Morrissey of Bally Haly Golf Club," said Hryniw, who joined Bally Haly Club in 1977.

He said the highlights of his 30-year golf career came in 1980. He became the first Newfoundland golfer to make the cut at the national amateur championship in Halifax and shot a hole-in-one at Bally Haly.

Hryniw explained that making the cut means he could continue to play in the national championship

after the second round. Forty percent of the field following the 150-golfer competition gets to play the final two rounds of the competition. Hryniw finished 45th overall that year. He duplicated the feat when he made the cut at the 1982 national championship.

"Shooting the hole-in-one and making the cut twice at the national championship were achievements I will always cherish," said Hryniw.

Hryniw has many reasons why Newfoundland golfers don't fare too well in national competition. "There are less golfers playing in the province than in a majority of the other provinces in Canada and for another thing the golf courses in Newfoundland are not 'top quality championship golf courses'."

He said the short golf season coupled with the unpredictable weather in Newfoundland are two other factors against Newfoundland golfers.

Hryniw and his wife Jeannette have two sons — Joey, 10, and Robbie, 3. They reside at 37 O'Reagan Rd

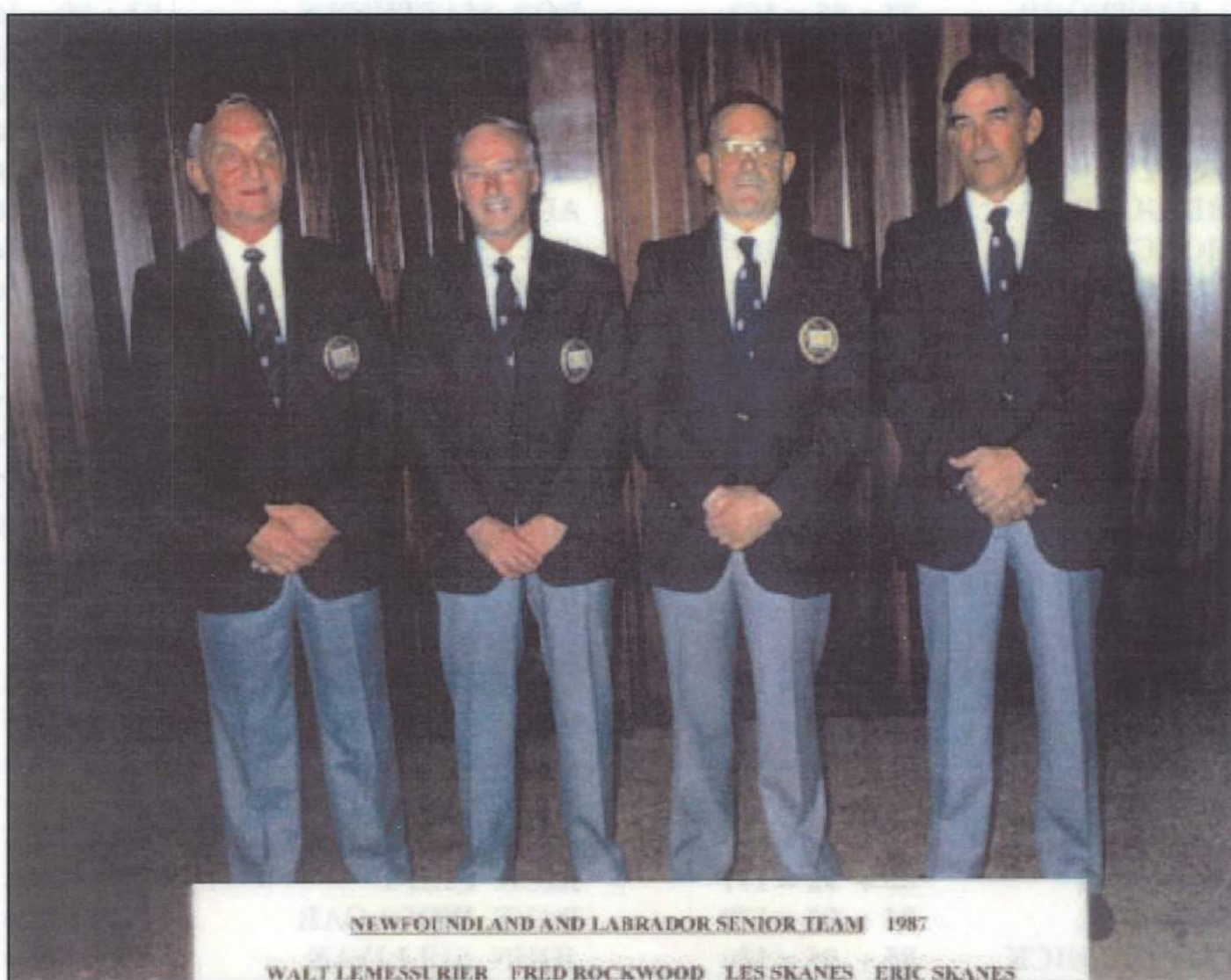

COURSE RECORD SET AT BALLY HALY

Bill Hryniw of St. John's thought he was going out for the last round of golf in the 1988 season at the Bally Haly Golf Course but this final round is not one he will likely forget. Hryniw, one of the top men's golfers in the province, had one eagle, eight birdies, seven pars and two bogies in shooting a new men's amateur club record of eight under par 63. The previous record of 65 was shared by five men including Hryniw and one of his playing partners, Rayner Lamb.

"It was surprising because it was my last round of golf for the season, the greens were aerated and I didn't expect something like that," said Hryniw. It was the best round of golf Hryniw has ever recorded. Regarding Rayner Lamb, "I wouldn't say he was too disappointed. He along with the other two fellows that I played with, Leo Barry and Jack MacGillvary, were encouraging me," said Hryniw, a native of Windsor, Ontario who moved to St. John's in 1973.

Hryniw was four under par after nine holes and a chip in for an eagle on the 10th hole was instrumental in his record performance. "Realistically, I knew that I had a shot at the record after that eagle on the tenth hole. The record was on my mind the rest of the round. Birdies on #12 and #13 really helped. I hit the ball well all day, putted great and the encouragement was wonderful," said Hryniw. Asked if his great score would entice him to play another round, Hryniw replied "I am going to hang up the clubs for the year and over the winter enjoy the round that I played on Sunday."

Top club players strut stuff in national field

They are not all great golfers, but they are all champions. That describes the 79 who will swing away at Niakwa Country Club for the next four days in the Royal Canadian Golf Association's fourth annual club champions championship.

Unlike most national competitions, this tournament has no handicap limit. The only qualification is that a golfer must be the champion from his own club during the previous season.

That's the only thing these players have in common. Some of them are handicappers, good enough to have represented their province in national competitions in the past. But, many are what might be termed "average" golfers, good enough to beat the others are their club, but never considered a threat elsewhere.

Criticism

"The RCGA has been criticized in the past because the programs were too much for the elite player," said Don Craig, a Manitoba governor of the association and co-chairman of this event with Al Macatavish.

"This tournament is a departure from that procedure. It gives the average representative Canadian golfer a chance to say he has competed at the national level."

"It's different from most of our RCGA tournaments because we really don't know too much about the players," said Stephen Ross, director of administration and amateur programs for the RCGA. "We know some of them because they've been at the Canadian Amateur, but most of these fellows are newcomers. That's what makes it interesting."

Travelling the greatest distance to take part is Bill Hryniw from the Bally Haly Golf Club at St. John's, Nfld., who is no stranger to national competition. He has played for Newfoundland in Willingdon Cup play in the past.

From the West are several players from British Columbia, including two from locations on Vancouver

Island (Stuart Holroyd of Gorge Vale in Victoria and Garry Brown from Clacier Greens at Comox) as well as Peter MacDonald, the club champion from the Gabriola Golf Club on Gabriola Island in the Gulf Islands.
